

Boston Marathon Bombing

(AP) - Two bombs exploded in the crowded streets near the finish line of the Boston Marathon on Monday, killing at least three people and injuring more than 140 in a bloody scene of shattered glass and severed limbs that raised alarms that terrorists might have struck again in the U.S.

A White House official speaking on condition of anonymity because the investigation was still unfolding said the attack was being treated as an act of terrorism.

President Barack Obama vowed that those responsible will "feel the full weight of justice."

As many as two unexploded bombs were also found near the end of the 26.2-mile course as part of what appeared to be a well-coordinated attack, but they were safely disarmed, according to a senior U.S. intelligence official, who also spoke on condition of anonymity because of the continuing investigation.

The fiery twin blasts took place about 10 seconds and about 100 yards apart, knocking spectators and at least one runner off their feet, shattering windows and sending dense plumes of smoke rising over the street and through the fluttering national flags lining the route. Blood stained the pavement, and huge shards were missing from window panes as high as three stories.

"They just started bringing people in with no limbs," said runner Tim Davey of Richmond, Va. He said he and his wife, Lisa, tried to shield their children's eyes from the gruesome scene inside a medical tent that had been set up to care for fatigued runners, but "they saw a lot."

"They just kept filling up with more and more casualties," Lisa Davey said. "Most everybody was conscious. They were very dazed."

Federal officials are denying that a suspect is in custody in the Boston Marathon bombings. A law enforcement official briefed on the investigation told The Associated Press on Wednesday a suspect was in custody.

Original Moorland YMCA Building Recognized As Texas Historic Landmark

Friday, April 12, 2013 beginning at 11:00 a.m., state, county and local officials will gathered at 2700 Flora Street in the Dallas Arts District to officially dedicate the original Moorland YMCA building as a Texas Historic Landmark.

Once serving a thriving African American community as a place for civic, social and political meetings, Moorland YMCA was built in 1930 to meet the educational, physical and cultural needs of the growing population. After 40 years of service and a shifting African American community from downtown Dallas to Oak Cliff, Moorland YMCA closed. A new facility located on Ledbetter Street in Oak Cliff would break ground in 1972 bearing the name of the former facility.

In subsequent years, the building was owned by Mrs. Pearl Forester (dba Forester Telephone Answering Service), and Gail Thoma Patterson (dba Proxy Answering Service) until it was purchased by Dallas Black Dance Theatre in 1999. "Dallas Black Dance Theatre Grabs a Piece of History" was the headline on the major news publications announcing the deal.

Participants in the ceremony of dedication included: state Rep. Helen Giddings; county Commissioner John Wiley Price; mayor of Dallas, Mike Rawlings; deputy mayor pro tem Tennell Atkins; Don Baynham (Dallas County Historical Commission); the Rev. Lelious A. Johnson (St. Paul Baptist Church); the Rev. Elzie Odom (St. Paul United Methodist Church); Dr. Frederick Todd, II; and Dr. Robert Prince.

Community participants included the James Madison High School, JROTC Color Guard, Dallas Symphony Orchestra Young Strings, Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing & Visual (BTWHSPVA) Mime Troupe and String Orchestra Performers.

WILMER-HUTCHINS HIGH SCHOOL MARKS NAMING OF AUDITORIUM AND BAND ROOM

The Dallas Independent School District will celebrate the naming of the Pinkie M. King Gardner Auditorium and the Robert A. Simpson Sr. Band Hall at 1 p.m. on Saturday, April 20, 2013, at Wilmer-Hutchins High School, 5520 Langdon Road. The Dallas ISD Board of Trustees has named portions of Wilmer-Hutchins High School for Ms. Pinkie M. Gardner and the late Mr. Robert A. Simpson Sr. for their contributors to the Wilmer-Hutchins community. The event will feature remarks from Dallas ISD School Board President Dr. Lew Blackburn, Dallas ISD Division 5 Assistant Superintendent Josephine Hernandez-Gutierrez, Dallas County Commissioner John Wiley Price, Hutchins Mayor Artis Johnson and Wilmer Mayor Hector Casarez, as well as family members of the two honorees. The celebration will include performances by the Wilmer-Hutchins High School Jazz Band and the Choral Ensemble.

Ms. Gardner, a lifelong resident of the city of Hutchins, is the only living member of the first and only graduating class of the Wilmer-Hutchins Colored High School, which was destroyed by fire in 1939. She is a strong advocate for

education and was an outspoken supporter of reopening the schools in Wilmer-Hutchins. A retired nurse, she continues to serve on the board of the Oak Cliff Boys and Girls Club, the city of Dallas Advisory Board for Older Adults and the state Advisory Council for the Aging in addition to serving as a Dallas County election judge.

The late Mr. Robert A. Simpson Sr. served as band instructor in the Wilmer-Hutchins ISD for 31 years and was the district's first African American band director. He touched the lives of hundreds of students during his time as director of the Wilmer-Hutchins High School Marching Band. A professional musician who played with a number of popular performing artists, Mr. Simpson wrote and played music for Abnak Music Enterprise and served as music director for several arts organizations before founding and serving as the executive director of his own non-profit Third Coast Arts Center in 2002. In 2009, in honor of his contributions to the field of musical arts, he was inducted into the Dallas Metroplex Musicians Association. Mr. Simpson passed away in February, 2009.

Businessman, Politician, and Civil Rights Leader Dr. Charles Steele Jr. to Deliver the 2013 Commencement Address for Jarvis Christian College

On Saturday, May 4, 2013, at 10:30 a.m. Jarvis Christian College will hold its commencement exercises at the E. W. Rand Center in the Anthony Robinson Varsity Gymnasium on the Jarvis campus. The commencement speaker will be businessman, politician and civil rights leader Dr. Charles Steele Jr. Dr. Steele is President Emeritus and CEO of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC).

A Tuscaloosa, Alabama native, Dr. Steele graduated from Druid High in Tuscaloosa, Alabama and attended college at Mississippi Valley State University and Oakland University. He received his bachelors from The F.T. Bozeman school of Ministry and Global Evangelical Christian College of Louisiana. He also received his masters from F.T. Bozeman Global Evangelical Seminary and received an earned doctorate degree from Mt. Carmel Theological Seminary. He holds several Honorary Doctorate Degrees.

In 1985 Dr. Steele became the first African American elected to the Tuscaloosa City Council. In 1994 he was elected to the Alabama State

Senate. In 2000 he was elected as a Senate member of the High Chamber (U.S. Parliamentary Group) of the International States parliament for Safety and Peace. In 2004 he became President of SCLC and served for five years. During that time he raised over 10 million dollars including 3.3 million dollars for the SCLC international headquarters. In 2009, he resigned from SCLC to start his own consulting firm, Charles Steele & Associates (CSA). In 2011 the board of SCLC unanimously voted Dr. Steele as President Emeritus. On July 2, 2012, he was elected Chief Executive Officer for the second time. He is the first SCLC CEO to ever hold this position twice.

As councilman Dr. Steele organized the Unity Day Scholarship Fund, the Tuscaloosa Police Athletic League, and secured funds for purchase of Palmore Park and Barrs' Quarters (Charles Steele Estates). He obtained the funds to build the Bernice Washington Insight Center (a drug treatment center) and organized the Tuscaloosa Drug Task Force and the Partnership for a drug free Tuscaloosa.

As a state senator he played a key role in recruiting

several new plants in his district. He sponsored a non-traditional educational program with Robert Townsend of Hollywood, California for the youth of his district. He also recruited the Rosa Parks movie to Alabama where he serves as a consultant and associate producer to the production of the \$7 million CBS movie project.

Under the slogan "New Day ... New Way," Dr. Steele and SCLC made history by breaking ground for their new and much anticipated \$3.3 million international headquarters. Dr. Steele raised money for the project through corporate friends and sponsors. During his five years as SCLC President and CEO he raised over 10 million dollars including the 3.3 million dollars he raised for the headquarters.

Jarvis Christian College is a historically Black liberal arts, baccalaureate, degree-granting institution affiliated with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Carlisle rips Mavericks' effort after loss to Grizzlies

AT PRESS TIME (AP) - One game after the Dallas Mavericks' ZZ Top-like beards were gone, they may make an encore appearance.

A day after finally getting to share after reaching the .500 mark for the first time in over four months, the Mavs dropped below that magical barrier with Monday's 103-97 loss to the Memphis Grizzlies at American Airlines Center.

Now 40-41, the Mavs will end their season at 7 p.m. Wednesday at home against the New Orleans Hornets.

"We've got one left and we've got a chance to avoid a losing record, and I think that is significant," coach Rick Carlisle said. "We've got to get ready for Wednesday."

Memphis beat up the Mavs on the backboards 50-36, including 16-8 on the offensive end. The Grizzlies turned 15 Mavs turnovers into 25 points.

The Grizzlies' bench came in averaging 27 points per game, but outscored the Mavs' bench 64-44.

"They made a lot more plays than we did and we made a lot of mistakes," Carlisle said. "We had some guys who didn't show, literally, and just didn't compete for us the

way that we needed them to compete, so it's really disappointing."

One of those players who had a subpar game was guard O.J. Mayo, who spent his first four seasons with Memphis before joining the Mavs last summer via free agency.

"He wasn't into it the first half," Carlisle said of Mayo. "We showed him some film at halftime where he virtually was just standing around defensively. I said, 'Hey, we need you.'"

"He just had a bad night; I guess I'll write it off to that. But I tell you what, if I was playing against my former team I'd come out ready to go at them. But that's me."

Mayo was scoreless in the first half and finished with just two points on 1-of-6 shooting, and he also committed four turnovers in 28 minutes.

"With all the time that we put into helping him develop and bringing him along, in the biggest game of the year and an opportunity to be a winning team, for him to show up like he did tonight, I was shocked," Carlisle said. "I just want to see him show up. I want to see him show up and compete. He didn't compete tonight."

Super voice gone: Pat Summerall dead at 82

Over four decades, Summerall described some of the biggest games in America in his deep, resonant voice. Simple, spare, he delivered the details on 16 Super Bowls, the Masters and the U.S. Open tennis tournament with a simple, understated style that was the perfect complement for the "booms!" and "bangs!" of Madden, his football partner for the last half of the NFL player-turned-broadcaster's career.

Summerall died Tuesday at age 82 of cardiac arrest, said University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center spokesman Jeff Carlton, speaking on behalf of Summerall's wife, Cheri.

"Pat was my broadcasting partner for a long time, but more than that he was my friend for all of these years," Madden said in a statement. "Pat Summerall is the voice of football and always will be."

His final play-by-play words beside Madden were succinct, of course, as he called the game-ending field goal of the Super Bowl for Fox on Feb. 3, 2002, when New England beat St. Louis 20-17.

Serena Has Taken Tennis To Another Level

Serena Williams is making history on the WTA circuit...

The game of tennis for women will never be the same after 2013, all because of the outstanding play of the number one player in the world, **Serena Williams**. Her dad, Richard Williams, predicted this years ago when she was only nine years old, and following in the footsteps of her older sister, Venus.

At the time, Venus was shocking the world, an African-American girl from Compton, California, making it to the finals and winning Grand Slam events in the U.S. and around the world. "This is nothing compared to what you'll see when Serena gets her chance," were the words spoken by Richard at a press interview during the US Open in New York after Venus had won a very controversial match that placed her in the finals.

At the end of 2012, Serena captured the singles gold medal at the Olympics where she defeated consecutively the three most recent WTA No. 1s, not losing more than three games to any of them. She won five tournaments, including Wimbledon and the US Open, becoming the first woman to claim consecutive Grand Slam tournament singles crowns in a calendar year, a repeat of her performance in 2002. She reclaimed the No. 1 singles spot in the WTA as a result of this performance.

An exhibition of her dominance on the women's professional tennis tour took place at the BNP Paribas Showdown in New York on March 4, 2013. The Showdown is a major event that brings the top players in the world together to decide who is number one in tennis.

Taking her record in tennis to the next level where she stands alone, occurred at the Sony Open, another major event that brought 128 of the top players in the world together in Miami, Florida, March 18-31, 2013.

During the two-weeks event, Serena captured the title by defeating three of the top seeds, Marie Sharapova (3), Agnieszka Radwanska (4), and Na Li (5). Winning this title clearly put Serena into the lead in this event with six championships to her credit.

Serena has reached a higher level in tennis that poses a constant threat on the courts at the French Open, Wimbledon, and the US Open, three remaining events that she faces during the remainder of the year.
