(AP)- Police arrested Deion Sanders' estranged wife on an assault charge that the Hall of Fame cornerback claims was for breaking into his room and attacking him in front of their children, on Monday, April 23, 2012.

A judge issued an emergency protective order against Pilar Sanders Tuesday before releasing her from custody, banning her from entering the ex-couple's Texas mansion for the next two months. She's also prohibited from threatening or harassing any member of the family.

DALLAS ISD SEEKS CONTINUATION OF ADULT BASIC EDUCATION CLASSES

The Dallas Independent School District is submitting a grant application to the Texas Education Agency to ensure a continuation of Adult Basic Education services for adult learners during the 2012-2013 school year.

The district's Adult Basic Education program provides free GED, ESL, and Civics classes to adults in Dallas and Rockwall counties.

Under state grants, the district has offered the program for 38 years with the purpose of enabling adult learners to be literate, productive, and successful in the workplace, home and community by delivering comprehensive adult education instruction in a learner-centered, supportive and collaborative environment.

"In its decision to continue providing the adult education program, Dallas ISD will make a tremendously positive impact on our community by allowing

adult learners, many of whom are parents of district students, to benefit from our free classes," said Leslie Boyd, Director-Adult Basic Education Department.

"In these classes, our students will gain knowledge that will give them better employment opportunities by making them more marketable in the workforce; will impact their home by enabling their entire family to engage together in learning; and will increase their civic responsibility and obligation for community engagement. While they increase their own literacy skills, the adult learners will also learn ways to help their children increase literacy readiness for school."

Under a \$4.6 million grant, the district's Adult Basic Education Department offers classes at 14 sites. During the fall semester, approximately 4,000 adult students received the classes.





"I know that my Redeemer lives" (Job 19:25). People often will quote this verse during Easter. This verse helps to affirm our faith in our savior. The rest of this verse goes on to say that when it's all said and done, our Savior will stand on the earth. It says, "...and that in

What a marvelous Royal Psalm we have before us. Royal or Messianic Psalms depict some aspect of the person and ministry of our Supreme King, Jesus Christ.

Some of the other Royal Psalms are Psalm 18, 20, 21, 45, 72, 89, 101, 110, 132, and 144. The grand Psalm 2 begins with the psalmist expressing his utter astonishment at the plot of the nations in their attempt to defeat the Lord and His anointed One, Jesus Christ. No nation, nor kings of nations can thwart the ultimate plan of God. With that truth being a reality, God's ultimate purpose for this earth and eternity will be fulfilled. It is absolutely futile for any ruler to defeat God and His purpose for humanity.

God's plan, which was conceived in eternity past, will be implemented, regardless of who might be the ruler. God's plan will never be frustrated by mortal man - although that

Jesus our Lord."

So, in verses 1-3, the psalmist expresses his utter astonishment in the nations to plot against the Lord and His anointed One - Jesus Christ. In verse 3, the nations expressed their desire to free themselves from the King's ruler-ship. Having looked at the nations' rebellion in verses 1-3, the psalmist emphasizes the Lord's reaction to their plan. He gives us a picture of God laughing at their plan.

From the Lord's elevated view from heaven, He laughs at mortal man in his foolish attempt to oppose Him! Their evil plan will not go unnoticed, for God will speak in His wrath against them (vs. 5-6). In spite of all their evil planning, the Lord's King will sit on the throne (v. 6). The rulers may have their resolves, but God's resolve is greater! When God plants His King, all of those who are in opposition to Him will be dealt with. The word "Zion" in verse 6 refers to Jerusalem and one day the Messiah, Jesus Christ, will reign supremely during the Millennium (the thousand year reign of Christ -

Isaiah 2:3).

God's King will surely reign because of His decree. In other words, He has a right to reign because of God's decree. The decree refers to the Davidic Covenant that the Lord declared with David. In that decree, there existed a Father-Son relationship or affiliation (v. 7). Because of the fact that He is King, the Son will inherit the Kingdom from His Father (v. 8). And because He is King, He has the right to ask for His inheritance. When He establishes His Kingdom, He will suppress all rebellious people against Him (v. 9).

In view of the fact that the Lord will reign, the psalmist exhorts the foolish nations to surrender to the King before God unleashes His wrath (vs. 10-11). Instead of rebelling against the King who will ultimately reign, the psalmist exhorted the rebellious to submit to the Sovereign One. Instead of rebelling, they need to "kiss the Son!" (v. 12). Finally, you are indeed blessed when you trust in God's King - Jesus Christ.

The positive demonstrations of support for the family of Trayvon Martin following his tragic death, and the nationwide evidence of unified response (hoodies everywhere!) and the call for justice are inspiring signs of a renewed spirit among African Americans and others committed to correcting the obvious inequities exposed in the wake of this travesty.

Clearly, nothing we encounter in the world of business can be equated to the senseless slaying of this young man. And as Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

taught us in his Letter from a Birmingham Jail, "... injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere..."

We are clear that there is no way the shock, hurt and grief Trayvon's family endures because of the absolutely inhuman conduct of one misguided individual can be compared to the struggles of businessmen and women. We can't help, however, but draw parallels to the inequity Black business owners must contend with each and every day.

The deck is stacked against you: When the courts rule against you... when financial institutions refuse to extend credit to you... when even governments you support through your tax dollars can't bring themselves to provide equal opportunity... well, you get the picture. As a class, the businesses we work hard to represent face odds no other group faces in this country.

And just as there are incredulous voices that somehow defend the series

of bad decisions that resulted in the senseless snuffing out of a young life, there are those who believe there is nothing wrong with a marketplace that delivers fractional percentage points of opportunity to Black-owned businesses.

You've seen the numbers in this space before. According to the Census Bureau, there are 1.9 million privately held Black-owned businesses across every industry sector in the United States. We employ more than 921,000 people and generate \$137.5 billion in annual revenue. According to a report by the Nielsen Company, African Americans spend more than a trillion hard-earned dollars in the U.S. economy. Tragically, even this spending does not translate to reciprocity in the form of contracting/vendor relationships from the corporations that benefit from our dollars.

Tragically, the giant loopholes in regulations guiding federal, state and local utilization of ethnic minority

suppliers allow for interpretations that boggle the mind - and devastate our businesses and their hope for a brighter future.

It is beyond unfortunate that it takes the senseless slaying of a future businessman, a future lawyer, a future elected official, a future husband and father to cause us to take stock of all the inequity around us. But it is the re-awakened sense of outrage that will fuel our commitment to correct the wrongs we see around us.

And though our commitment to improving opportunities for Black-owned businesses across this country is solid and sincere, the outpouring of support for justice in Florida fortifies us and strengthens our resolve to stay on the battlefield. There is no doubt that the same energy that awakened so many of us to Trayvon's murder is the same energy that will drive our achieving economic parity in America's marketplace.

George Zimmerman's Bond- \$150,000

(AP)-George Zimmerman was released around midnight Sunday from a Florida county jail on \$150,000 bond as he awaits his second-degree murder trial for fatally shooting Trayvon Martin.

The neighborhood watch volunteer was wearing a brown jacket and blue jeans and carrying a paper bag. He walked out following another man and didn't look over at photographers gathered outside. He then followed the man into a white BMW vehicle and drove away.

Moments before, two Seminole County sheriff's vehicles blocked access to the intake building parking lot where Zimmerman was being released. Zimmerman emerged after two public information officers confirmed the credentials of the photographers outside.

No questions were shouted at Zimmerman, and he gave no statement.

His ultimate destination is being kept secret for his safety and it could be outside Florida.

Circuit Judge Kenneth Lester said at a hearing Friday he cannot have any

guns and must observe a 7 p.m.-to-6 a.m. curfew. Zimmerman also surrendered his passport.

Zimmerman had to put up 10 percent, or \$15,000, to make bail. His father had indicated he might take out a second mortgage.

Zimmerman worked at a mortgage risk-management company at the time of the shooting and his wife is in nursing school. A website was set up to collect donations for Zimmerman's defense fund. It is unclear how much has been raised.

Bond is not unheard of in second-degree murder cases, and legal experts had predicted it would be granted for Zimmerman because of his ties to the community, because he turned himself in after he was charged last week, and because he has never been convicted of a serious crime.

Prosecutors had asked for \$1 million bail, citing two previous scrapes Zimmerman had with the law, neither of which resulted in charges. In 2005, he had to take anger management courses after he was accused of attacking an undercover officer who was trying to arrest

Zimmerman's friend. In another incident, a girlfriend accused him of attacking her.

Zimmerman, 28, fatally shot Martin, 17, Feb. 26 inside the gated community where Zimmerman lived during an altercation. Martin was unarmed and was walking back to the home of his father's fiancee when Zimmerman saw him, called 911 and began following him. A fight broke out -- investigators say it is unknown who started it.

Meanwhile, Martin's parents published a "Card of Thanks" in The Miami Herald obituary page Sunday. The note says Sybrina Fulton and Tracy Martin express their appreciation for all the public's support since their son's death. The notice includes a photograph of Trayvon Martin dressed in a hooded sweatshirt, similar to one he was wearing the evening he was killed.

"Words will never express how your love, support and prayers lifted our spirits and continue to give us the strength to march on," the letter says.

A funeral was held for Justice at 1 p.m. Saturday in Carrollton at Tooth Acres, 1639 Parker Road. All were welcomed to attend.

(AP)-Domestic violence everywhere lives in the shadows, and in China it thrives in a secrecy instilled by tradition that holds family conflicts to be private. In fact, at least one in four women in China is estimated to have been a victim of domestic violence at some point in her life, surveys show, with the rate in rural areas as high as two out of every three women. The violence takes many forms, from physical and sexual assault to emotional abuse or economic deprivation.

(AP)- The worst appears to be over. Gasoline prices are starting to fall. After a four-month surge pushed gasoline to nearly \$4 per gallon in early April, drivers, politicians and economist worried that gasoline prices might soar past all-time highs, denting wallets, angering voters and dragging down an economy that is struggling to grow. Instead, pump prices have dropped 6 cents over two weeks to a national average of \$3.88.

(AP) - The NBA responded to Metta World Peace's latest act of aggression with a seven-game suspension that will lighten the Los Angeles Lakers troublemaker's wallet and playoff schedule.

World Peace was suspended Tuesday for throwing a vicious elbow at Oklahoma City's James Harden, keeping the Lakers' starting small forward sidelined for most of the first postseason round.

World Peace was ejected from Sunday's game against the Thunder for striking Harden in the head with the back of his elbow, giving Oklahoma City's top reserve a concussion. The former Ron Artest claimed the blow was an accidental, overzealous celebration of a dunk, yet even Kobe Bryant and his Lakers teammates weren't defending his inexplicable actions.

"It's hard to get into a guy's head and know exactly what happened in that situation," Bryant said. "I haven't really spoken to him about it. You've really got to ask him."

World Peace will miss the Lakers' season finale on Thursday at Sacramento and the Lakers' next six games. The playoffs open Saturday, and Los Angeles is likely to be the Western Conference's third seed - and Oklahoma City is locked into the No. 2 seed, meaning the clubs could meet right after World Peace's suspension ends in the second round.
