U.S. Senate Confirmed The First African American Woman Loretta Lynch As U.S. Attorney General



(AP) - Loretta Lynch was sworn in Monday as the 83rd U.S. attorney general, the first African-American woman to serve as the nation's top law enforcement official.

Speaking before an audience of family members, Justice Department lawyers and supporters, Lynch said her confirmation as attorney general showed that "we can do anything" and pledged that the agency would "use justice as our compass" in confronting terrorism, cyberattacks and other threats facing the country.

"We can imbue our criminal justice system with both strength and fairness, for the protection of both the needs of victims and the rights of all. We can restore trust and faith both in our laws and in those of us who enforce them," Lynch said, an apparent reference to ongoing efforts to repair relations between police departments and the minority communities that they serve.

May 9th Elections

Baltimore Mayor Condemns Clashes, Announces Curfew

Baltimore - Monday night, as looters took over Mondawmin Mall, Baltimore Mayor Stephanie Rawlings Blake was at the Office of Emergency Management for a news conference to address the destruction that overtook parts of the city earlier that day. Joined by Chief of Patrol for the Baltimore Police Department Col. Darryl De Sousa, City Council President Jack Young and Baltimore City councilman Brandon Scott - Rawlings Blake said there was a difference

between people who peacefully protested and "the thugs who only want to incite violence."

The mayor announced a city-wide curfew that would last from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. She said the curfew was to last a week and be extended as necessary.

"If you are on the streets, it will be medical emergency or you are going to work," she said.

The announcement came after several hours' worth of clashes between young people and police. In pictures posted to social media accounts, officers armed with riot gear could be seen facing off against a

large group of young people at Mondawmin Mall. The officers reported being hit by bricks, glass bottles and other debris. People on the scene reported being hit with rubber bullets and sprayed by pepper spray.

Among property damage from the day's events was a CVS store at North and Pennsylvania, which caught fire. There were also reports of destruction of police cars and small fires in the streets.

Rawlings Blake said that she has been in touch with Maryland Gov. Larry Hogan, who had activated the National Guard.

She also addressed concerns that she was not visible during much of the looting, saying that she was at work managing the situation behind the scenes.

Trade Deal is Good for DallasBY CONGRESSWOMAN

During the coming months, Congress will be asked to consider the most comprehensive and ambitious trade deal of our time. The Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) is one of the cornerstones of President Barack Obama's trade agenda. It seeks to improve the U.S. economy and those of eleven other countries.

Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Peru, Singapore and Vietnam are dependent upon the comprehensive and high-standard free trade agreement.

Some of these countries lack minimum labor, environmental, and humanitarian standards, all of which President Obama and his chief negotiators strive to address and enforce in the TPP deal.

Before TPP or the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (T-TIP) can be considered by Congress, a trade promotion authority (TPA) bill must be passed.

TPA bills outline Congressional guidance to the administration on trade policy and establish requirements for trade agreements. Many refer to TPA as "fast track" because trade agreements would be sent to Congress for an up-or-down vote with no amendments allowed.

Essentially, this gives the administration the power to negotiate trade deals without Congressional input. Prior TPA bills have established the fast-track measure; however, a TPA bill currently under consideration includes language that enables Congress

Loretta Lynch Came from a Family of Activists

After a 166-day partisan political struggle in the U.S. Senate to confirm the first Black American woman to be the attorney general of the United States, finally on the afternoon of April 23, history was made. Loretta Elizabeth Lynch has now been confirmed by the Senate by a vote of 56 to 43 after being nominated last year by President Barack Obama.

I have known the Lynch family for a long time in Durham, N.C., where Loretta Lynch's father, Rev. Lorenzo Lynch Sr., served faithfully as the Senior Pastor of the legendary White Rock Baptist Church from 1965 to 1993. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. gave one his famous sermons in 1960 at the White Rock Baptist Church titled, "Fill Up the Jails," that encouraged nonviolent civil disobedience as the strategic tactic to advance civil rights.

Loretta Lynch, in addition to being well qualified to be the attorney general of the U.S. as an accomplished federal prosecutor and legal scholar, also comes from a strong Black American family that has made outstanding contributions and sacrifices toward the progress of Black America for over four generations in North Carolina and throughout the nation.

President Obama made the right decision at the right time concerning Loretta Lynch. The baton is being passed now from Attorney General Eric Holder, who did an outstanding job as the first Black American to be attorney general, to Loretta Lynch at a time when rampant racially motivated police killings of Black people across the nation is escalating anew.

Racism persists in America in part because it is not called out enough. Yes, we have made progress toward racial equality and justice. But we are not there yet. We have not reached the finish line to end racial injustice and inequality. We still have not overcome and we must remain vigilant and vocal and in the quest for freedom, justice and equality.

We, therefore congratulate Attorney General Loretta Lynch and wish her all the best. It will not be easy, but we know and believe that more great achievement and national leadership are on the horizon of the future. Thank you Sister Lynch for making history and for continuing to make a difference.

Isaiah's prophecy, we have seen, gives us a vivid picture of the suffering ministry of our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Many scholars believe that Isaiah chapter 53 is a part of a series of poems called servant songs. This song begins in Isaiah chapter 52:13 through Isaiah chapter 53:12. In this chapter 53, we are acquainted with the early life and ministry of Jesus Christ; a life that was characterized by being misunderstood and being subjected to untold suffering for you and me. Certainly, this chapter unfolds that He indeed suffered for us. Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, wrote centuries later that Jesus Christ suffered the humiliation of the cross experience when he said: "Who His Own self bare our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed." Let's see something here in Isaiah 53 - Our Lord was rejected for us, died and was buried for us, rose and gained the victory for us, and has a continuing prayer ministry for us as He sits at the right hand (honor) of the Father. 



She spoke out against what she called a blatant mischaracterization of her words about destruction and violence that happened after a day of peaceful protests on Saturday.

"I was asked a question about property damage. We balance a very fine line between giving peaceful protestors space to protest. People can hijack that and use that place for bad. I didn't say we were accepting of that."

De Sousa said that 15 police officers had been injured by flying debris during the unrest. He said most had been treated

for minor injuries and released, while two remained hospitalized.

He said that 75-100 school-aged children caused the violence. He said, as of the conference, 27 arrests had been made. He also said that police would be monitoring video to determine if any other arrests would be made.

"Could we have done things differently? We have to assess that," he said.

Councilman Jack Young also condemned the clashes.

"This is unacceptable. This is not what Freddie Gray's family

wanted," he said.

"These are thugs who are seizing upon an opportunity to show their anger and distrust. We have to let the Department of Justice and the state attorney do their job. Our job is to get it right," he said. "It's your job as the media to report that."

"These are not the people who live in Sandtown-Winchester," he said. These are opportunists and we are not going to tolerate it. Justice will prevail."
