

Her Turn Now: Hillary Clinton Promises Steady Hand in Dangerous World

(AP) — Promising Americans a steady hand, Hillary Clinton cast herself Thursday night as a unifier for divided times, an experienced leader steeled for a volatile world. She aggressively challenged Republican Donald Trump's ability to do the same.

"Imagine him in the Oval Office facing a real crisis," Clinton said as she accepted the Democratic nomination for president. "A man you can bait with a tweet is not a man we can trust with nuclear weapons."

Clinton took the stage to roaring applause from flag-waving delegates on the final night of the Democratic convention, relishing her nomination as the first woman to lead a major U.S. political party. The program paid tribute to law enforcement officers killed on duty, including five who died in Dallas earlier this month in retaliation for officer-involved shootings in Minnesota and Louisiana.

Through four nights of polished convention pageantry, Democratic heavyweights told a different story about Clinton. The most powerful validation came Wednesday night from President Barack Obama, her victorious primary rival in 2008. Obama declared Clinton not only can defeat Trump's "deeply pessimistic vision" but also realize the "promise of this great nation."

Seeking to offset possible weariness with a politician who has been in the spotlight for decades, he said of Clinton: "She's been there for us, even if we haven't always noticed."

Clinton was introduced by her daughter, Chelsea, who spoke warmly of her mother as a woman "driven by compassion, by faith, by kindness, a fierce sense of justice, and a heart full of love."

"Violence is not the answer," Dallas Sheriff Lupe Valdez said. "Yelling, screaming and calling each other names is not going to do it."

On the convention's closing night, Clinton sought to reach beyond the Democratic base, particularly to moderate Republicans unnerved by Trump.

SHOW ME THE MONEY: GLOBAL HIV/AIDS FUNDING ON THE DECLINE

Throughout AIDS 2016, whispers that global funds to fight HIV/AIDS have begun to dry up have turned to shouts. In the crowded hallways of the International Convention Center, on panels, plenaries and even t-shirts, everybody seems to be worried that The Global Fund to Fight HIV, Tuberculosis and Malaria won't be fully funded and international dollars are fading away. In fact, organizers of Monday's march through Durban said they created their event to bring attention to the "massive disconnect" between the promises to end HIV/AIDS by 2030 and the lack of funding to actually make it happen.

But is this a Chicken Little tactic to create the appearance of need? Or is it real? According to a new report, yes, it's real.

Donor government funding to support HIV efforts in low- and middle-income countries fell for the first time in five years in 2015, according to data gathered and analyzed jointly by the Kaiser Family Foundation and UNAIDS. In U.S. currency, over \$1 billion dried up; AIDS money dropped from \$8.6 billion in 2014 to \$7.5 billion in 2015, a 13 percent decline.

Money matters. With the goal of ending AIDS by 2030, the movement has reached a critical moment. As death rates have plummeted, more and more people require life-saving treatment. In essence, the epidemic has become a "victim" of its own success. In 2000 when the AIDS conference was first held in Durban, 1.5 million peo-

ple died from AIDS around the world; that number dropped to about 1 million in 2015. Sixteen years ago, 770,000 people living with the virus had access to treatment, compared to 17 million currently.

UNAIDS estimates that to reach its "fast track" goals and end AIDS in the next 14 years requires an increase of at least \$7.2 billion by 2020. "Our progress is incredibly fragile," said Michel Sidibe, executive director of UNAIDS. "If we do not act now, we risk resurgence and resistance."

The United States contributes the lion's share to global funding—66 percent—and American dollars decreased from \$5.6 billion in 2014 to \$5 billion in 2015. The vast majority of our money funds specific projects and programs, with an additional 14 percent given to The Global Fund.

(Overall contributions to the Global Fund dropped by \$305 million.) The U.K. follows the U.S. in donations, supplying 13 percent of AIDS money. With a nod to the disruption

occurring in that country, one conference attendee carried a sign that read England—Don't "Brexit" the AIDS Response.

Funding for HIV declined for 13 of 14 donor governments assessed in the analysis, in part because of a technical reason: The U.S. dollar became stronger, resulting in the depreciation of most other donor currencies.

Even some of the drop in funding from the U.S. itself can be explained away on paper. The U.S. pushed some of its dollars into the 2016 spread sheet to pay for the new DREAMS project aimed at attacking HIV infections among girls and young women in sub-Saharan Africa and to expand male circumcision services in many of the same countries.

Still, in the words of Jen Kates, one of the authors of the report, "it's a real decline."

In our increasingly complicated and unstable world, a tangle of reasons explain the funding drop off. "We know that governments are facing fiscal

austerity measures," explained Kates, a Kaiser Family Foundation vice president. "We also know that they are faced with competing demands, including refugee and humanitarian emergencies that are affecting their budgets."

No matter the explanations, activists are worried—and angry. "We can't be silent in the face of hypocrisy and broken promises," said Nkhensani Mavasa, chair of South Africa's Treatment Action Campaign, during the AIDS 2016 opening ceremony. "Governments are refusing to deliver funding increases and this is unacceptable."

More bluntly, she added: "When your house is burning and your family is inside, you don't beg quietly but you shout and you scream. Our house is still burning."

"A SURVEY OF THE BOOK OF ROMANS"

ROMANS 8:1-11

VICTORY OVER THE ENSLAVING POWER OF SIN, PART I

As we viewed Chapter 7 of Romans, Paul was experiencing a perplexing Christian life; in contrast in Chapter 8, one explores the great blessings possessed by the believer through Jesus Christ (Romans 7:25). In Romans 8:1, the key to victory for each believer is to be thoroughly convinced that our great God has removed from him all condemnation. The expression "no condemnation" means not only deliverance from sin's guilt, but also from sin's

power."

In the believer's spiritual walk, all he needs to do is to yield to the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit for victory (Galatians 5:16). The believer is tremendously blessed in his spiritual life because his new state is expressed by saying that he is "in Christ". His new state of being "in Christ" (Romans 8:1) has replaced the old state in Romans 7:6. Because of a believer's wonderful union with Christ as expressed in verse 1, the believer is to know that he is totally liberated from the Law of sin and death (v. 2).

In verses 3-4, the foundation for a believer's new walk in the Holy Spirit is due to the fact that God sent Jesus Christ to die a vicarious death for mankind; and through His sacrificial death, Christ paid the full payment for sin and made it possible for each believ-

er to live a Spirit-empowered life. Through the indwelling Holy Spirit, God fulfills the righteous demands of the Law in those who "walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit" (v. 4).

In verse 5, the Apostle Paul contrasts the life of one who is controlled by the sinful nature and one controlled by the Spirit. The one controlled by the sinful nature will have his mind set on what the nature desires; whereas the one who is controlled by the Spirit will have his mind set on what the Spirit desires. Paul explains in verse 6 that the mind of a carnal minded man (sinful man) is death. However, the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace (v. 6).

The sinful mind of verse 6 is totally hostile to God and does not submit to God's law (v. 7).

Therefore, the one who is controlled by the sinful nature cannot appease God (v. 8). Having spoken about the contrasting lives of those who are controlled by the sinful nature versus those controlled by the Holy Spirit,

Paul told these Roman believers that they were indwelled by the Holy Spirit; therefore, they are not to be controlled by the sinful nature, but by the Holy Spirit (v. 9). Because of the indwelling presence of Christ in a believer's life, a believer is alive spiritually. Finally, the grand Apostle related to these believers that God has guaranteed spiritual resurrection power for their mortal bodies and physical resurrection for their mortal bodies in the future at the Rapture (v. 11).



Texas Sales Tax Holiday is Aug. 5-7

(AUSTIN) - Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar reminds shoppers they can save money on certain items priced for less than \$100 during the state's annual sales tax holiday. This year, the sales tax holiday is scheduled for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 5-7.

The law exempts most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks priced below \$100 from sales tax, saving shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend during the weekend.

"As families all over our state prepare to send their children back to school, we hope folks take advantage of this opportunity to get the supplies they need and save some money in the process," Hegar said. "As the father of three young children, I know how these expenses can add up. This event provides Texas families with some relief from state and local sales taxes."


Lists of apparel and school supplies that may be purchased tax-free can be found on the Comptroller's website at TexasTaxHoliday.org.

This year, shoppers will save an estimated \$92 million in state and local sales taxes during the sales tax holiday.

Parkland physician offers tips to prevent heat-related illnesses, injuries

Athletes, band members at risk during summer 'two-a-days'

This time of the year student athletes and band members across Dallas-Fort Worth are engaging in twice-daily practices in anticipation of the upcoming football season. And even though the Metroplex averages 18 100-degree days a year, Parkland Health & Hospital System physicians warn that heat exhaustion can be deadly even if temperatures don't hit the century mark.

A combination of high humidity and temperatures in the '90s can have the same effect as triple-digit days. Exposure to extreme heat can result in illnesses and injuries, heat stroke, heat exhaustion, heat cramps or heat-related rashes. In the last six years Parkland Memorial Hospital has seen more than 240 patients with heat-related diagnoses in its emergency department.

"A lot of schools are holding 'two-a-days' to prepare for the upcoming season. Even though many of the practices are held before sunrise or after sunset there is still a risk for injuries that directly correspond to the heat," said Alexander L. Eastman, MD, MPH, Medical Director and Chief of the Rees-Jones Trauma Center at Parkland and Assistant Professor of Surgery at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. "Most people lose as much as one to two quarts of fluid during an hour of exercise. When you're not drinking enough fluids, your muscles get tired quickly and you may have leg cramps while walking or running."

Athletes, Dr. Eastman said, can lose as much as three quarts of fluids an hour during an intense workout, leading to illnesses such as heat exhaustion.

Heat exhaustion occurs when people are exposed to high temperatures, especially when combined with strenuous physical activity and humidity, and when the body loses fluids and becomes dehydrated. When heat exhaustion elevates, it may result in heat stroke, a life-threatening medical condition occurring when the body's cooling system, which is controlled by the brain, stops working. The resulting high body temperature causes damage to internal organs, including the brain, and could result in death.

"It's important that everyone, and in this case coaches and band directors, know the symptoms of heat-related illnesses, especially heat stroke which is the most serious heat-related disorder," Dr. Eastman said. "It occurs when the body becomes unable to control its temperature: the body's temperature

rises rapidly, the sweating mechanism fails, and the body is unable to cool down."

When heat stroke occurs, body temperature can rise to 106 degrees Fahrenheit or higher within 10 to 15 minutes. Heat stroke can cause death or permanent disability if emergency treatment is not given.

Dr. Eastman offers the following steps to treat an athlete with suspected heat stroke:

- Call 911 and notify their coach or a person in authority
- Move the person to a cool shaded area
- Cool him/her with methods such as:
- Soaking their clothes with water
- Spraying, sponging or showering them with water
- Fanning their body

"It's important to stop exercising, running, tackling or marching if you become dizzy or lightheaded or you feel very tired. Pay attention to your body and to those around you," Dr. Eastman added. "If you see something, say something because these are the critical first signs that something is wrong."
