

# THOUSANDS MOURN NELSON MANDELA

JOHANNESBURG (AP) - Thousands mourn Nelson Mandela, who "peacefully" died December 5, 2013 at 95 at his home in Johannesburg, surrounded by family. President Jacob Zuma. said " Our nation has lost its greatest son. Our people have lost a father. Although we knew that this day would come, nothing can diminish our sense of a profound and enduring loss."

Mandela had spent almost three months in a Pretoria hospital after being admitted in June with a recurring lung infection. Mandela, who had been in increasingly frail health in recent years, retired from public life in 2004. He is survived by his third wife, Graca Machel, three daughters (three other children died) and multiple grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

World leaders, family, friends and thousands of mourners who queued for hours to secure a seat in Johannesburg's FNB stadium paid tribute to South Africa's anti-apartheid icon Nelson Mandela. Here's a selection of quotes from the speeches at the memorial service and from mourners attending the event compiled by The Associated Press:

The cost of airfares has taken off and the price of gas is steadily declining, making travel by car the way to go this holiday season.

According to the a recent Wall Street Journal story, airfares on tickets sold for Thanksgiving and Christmas

weeks have risen 9.4 and 7.3 percent, respectively, compared with last year. On the other hand, CNN Money reports that gas prices are falling with nearly 20 percent of gas stations nationwide charging less than \$3 per gallon.

The superscription of this psalm reads, "To the chief Musician on Neginoth, Maschil, A Psalm of David, when the Ziphims came and said to Saul, Doth not David hide himself with us?" This psalm, written by David, reveals that David is in deep distress because the Ziphims had betrayed him. The background for this psalm is found in I Samuel 23. The life of David was filled with moments of betrayal: he was betrayed by Doeg in Psalm 52

### "A SAINT'S TRUST IN GOD'S DELIVERANCE" PSALM 54:1-7

(I Samuel 21-22); he was betrayed by Ahithophel in Psalm 55; and now he is being betrayed by the Ziphites (I Samuel 23:19).

In the midst of being betrayed, David cries out vehemently to the Lord in verses 1-2 as he says, "Save me O God, by thy name, and judge me by thy strength, Hear my prayer, O God; give ear to the words of my mouth." David cries out to the Lord, because the Ziphites had told Saul where David was hiding. They had truly betrayed David. Can't you feel the urgency of David's appeal to God, having been betrayed? David petitions the Lord to deliver him based on the name of God - His nature, character. In the midst of his distress, David calls upon the name of God, the only One who is able to help him in his distress.

David cites the reason for petitioning the Lord, for verse 3 says, "For strangers are risen up against me, and oppressors seek after my soul: they have not set God before them."

These vile and vicious men's aim was to destroy David; in addition, they had no regard for God. Although David felt the sting of being betrayed, in verses 4-7 he recognizes that the Lord will be his support. Because of his firm trust in the Lord, David knew that the Lord would judge his enemies - "He shall reward evil unto mine enemies: cut them off in thy truth" (v. 5). With supreme confidence in God's deliverance, David affirms to praise the Lord in verses 6-7, with a free will offering as an act of God's deliverance. He states, "I will freely sacrifice unto thee: I will praise thy

name, O LORD; for it is good" (v. 6).

Having read this beautiful psalm, I would like to testify and thank the Lord for delivering me from so many perils in life, and I love Him for that. I join the psalmist in Psalm 116:1-5 as he says, "I love the LORD, because he hath heard my voice and my supplications. Because he hath inclined His ear unto me, therefore will I call upon Him as long as I live. The sorrows of death compassed me, and the pains of hell gat hold upon me: I found trouble and sorrow. Then called I upon the name of the LORD; O LORD, I beseech thee, deliver my soul. Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; yea, our God is merciful."

sional, distancing himself from the underprivileged and the poor. But there was something different inside of Mandela that said that no man is whole unless all men are whole. And thus he embarked on a life of struggle for fairness and equality. It caused him pain and separation from his family, but he was willing to pay the price.

# THOUSANDS MOURN NELSON MANDELA

"For the people of South Africa, for those he inspired around the globe - Madiba's passing is rightly a time of mourning, and a time to celebrate a heroic life," said U.S. President Barack Obama in his speech at the memorial service, calling Mandela a "a giant of history ... In the arc of his life, we see a man who earned his place in history through struggle and shrewdness; through persistence and faith ... He accepted the consequences of his actions, knowing that standing up to powerful interests and injustice carries a price ... We will never see the likes of Nelson Mandela again. But let me say to the people of Africa, and young people around the world: You can make his life's work your own."

Mandela family friend Andrew Mlangeni said in his opening remarks Mandela "created hope where there was none." "He touched my heart, my soul, my life and those of the millions of South Africans," he added.

"To him, life was all about service to others," said family member Gen. Thanduxolo Mandela. "He mingled with kings, queens and presidents ... At the core, he was a man of the people."

"Let us pay tribute to Nelson Mandela: The ultimate symbol

of dignity and unwavering dedication to the revolutionary struggle, to freedom and justice, a prophet of unity, peace and reconciliation," Cuban President Raul Castro said through a translator. "As Mandela's life teaches us, only the concerted effort of all nations will empower humanity to respond to the enormous challenges that today threatens its very existence," he said, appealing for a global Mandela-inspired spirit of unity.

"Mr. Mandela was more than one of the greatest pillars of our time," United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said in his speech at the service. "He was one of our greatest teachers. He taught by example. He sacrificed so much ... for freedom and equality, for democracy and justice."

"He also was a source of inspiration for similar struggles in Brazil and across South America," Brazilian President Dilma Rousseff said through a translator. "His fight reached way beyond his nation's border and inspired young men and women to fight for independence and social justice."

"Mr. Mandela was the pride of the African people," Chinese Vice President Li Yuanchao said through a translator. "He has dedicated his entire life to the development and progress of the African continent."

"His life was just an extraordinary journey, from beginning to end, with such an effect, both on his own country, and on the rest of the world," former British Prime Minister Gordon Brown said before the service. "So, enjoy today, enjoy and celebrate what he achieved. We may not see his like again."

"I think Madiba would like us to celebrate and not be sad, to have smiles on our faces," said Muhammad Choonara, a 24-year-old university student, said during the memorial. Madiba is Mandela's clan name that most South African use as an endearment when speaking about the former president.

"Mandela was a very humble man and he gave himself to the world. He sacrificed time with his family for us and for me. It is a privilege to be here, it is a humbling experience," said Dipolelo Moshe, 35, who works for a marketing company. She had a South African flag draped over her shoulders and was carrying a big photo of Mandela as she stood in line at the stadium.

"I would not have the life I have today if it was not for him. I'm here to show my gratitude to Madiba. He was jailed so we could have our freedom," said Mathogonolo Mothoagae, 24, a marketing student, as she lined up to enter the stadium.

Gray, a native of Memphis Tenn., currently works part-time for the City of Grand Prairie as a coordinator for IMPACT Coalition, an organization whose mission is to eliminate underage drinking. She's also the executive director for Helping Us Help Her, also known as HUUH, an organization that helps teenage girls to develop the right tools to make the best decisions in life.

"I wake up, I go to bed thinking about what I can do to improve the organizations," Gray said. Her extreme work ethic stems from her mother, whom she said was a great influence on her life as a child. Her mother would do everything she could to help her siblings keep a roof over their heads and could have anything they needed.

As a child, she always wanted to become a doctor, so she could help people, and a mother. Gray became a mother to three children: Kaelyn Gray, 17; Mark Gray, 11; and Kaden Gray, 7.

She and her cousin made plans to graduate from college in Tennessee together and to move on to become doctors. But plans suddenly changed when Gray decided to move back to Arlington to help her mother.

Gray still ended up in the medical field, earning a degree in healthcare administration from the University of Texas in Arlington. She is a first-generation college graduate.

She doesn't regret moving back to Texas and changing her degree, but she does wish she had stuck to the plan with her cousin, who is now a doctor in Tennessee.

"I've accepted it, I've embraced it," she said. "I would not take anything from my journey because this is where God has me."

Deandra Durham, 38, has been a friend to Gray since junior high

school. Their friendship is perfect for Helping Us Help Her, where Durham works as an executive assistant.

"It's a balancing friendship," she said. "We play off of each other's strengths and weaknesses."

She didn't know how much help Durham would provide until they started building Helping Us Help Her together. Any time Gray needed help, Durham would be there. Whether it was filling out papers until 3 a.m. or attending a meeting when Gray could not be present, Durham stepped in.

She sees Gray as a very strong individual because outsiders would never know Gray has gone through so much in her life.

"She's always smiling, regardless of what she's going through," Durham said.

Gray faced adversity as a teenager. Because her parents worked overnight shifts, she had to become a mother figure to her younger siblings. Gray never wanted her mother to feel like she wasn't able to handle the responsibilities given, so Gray accepted the challenge and excelled.

One of Gray's most painful situations she had to overcome was when her father and her second child were both in the hospital at the same time. Her father was in ICU on one end of the second floor, and on the other end she was delivering her son, who later went into NICU, she said.

Her father and first son were the most important people in her life at the time, and she was unable to see either of them. It wasn't in her best health interest, since she just delivered a baby.

A few days later, she checked out the hospital on Father's Day and within 15 minutes of arriving home the hospital called.

"I thought they were calling me

to give a report on my son," Gray said. "And they called to tell me my father had just passed."

Through it all, she remains a hard worker and in high spirits, no matter the circumstances.

Keandra Hill, currently a freshman at the University of North Texas, has known Gray since she was born. Hill is Durham's daughter and has attended Helping Us Help Her events.

She sees Gray as an inspiring person in her life.

"Even when she's upset... she is so calm and collected, it's amazing," Hill said.

Gray has helped her become a confident young lady by not only telling but also showing her that she can make it through any obstacle with hard work and dedication.

"It's a presence that she has," Hill said. "I guess she's always had it."

Gray lives by the mantra she heard at a conference by guest speaker Dr. Samuel Chand, a self-proclaimed dream releaser:

"Your thoughts become your words, your words become your actions, your actions become your habits, your habits become your character and your character becomes your destiny."

She believes the best way to reach your destiny is to understand that every morning you wake up your life is in session; it's up to you to do what needs to be done in this session, and that will determine your day.

Gray went through many trials and tribulations in life. But instead of letting life bring her down, she keeps a smile on her face, works even harder and perseveres.

"I would like to be remembered as a young lady that gave her all," Gray said. "Trying to make the world a better place for young girls."
