DALLAS SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER TO LEAD TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY



(AP) - A Dallas schools trustee and investment manager will lead the Texas Education Agency.

Gov. Greg Abbott on Monday appointed Mike Morath to oversee the state's 1,200 school districts and charter schools.

Morath replaces Texas Education Commissioner Michael Williams, who in October cited family reasons and said he would leave at year's end. Williams led TEA since 2012 and served in state government more than 16 years.

Morath graduated from Garland High School and later taught computer science at his alma mater. Morath holds a bachelor's degree from The George Washington University. He was elected to the Dallas Independent School District board in 2011.

Morath is chairman of Morath Investments. He recently served as president of Minute Menu Systems, providing information systems to help manage a federal child nutrition program.

HOUSTON ELECTS NEW DEMOCRATIC MAYOR ENDORSED BY OBAMA



(AP) -- Houston has elected longtime Democratic lawmaker Sylvester Turner as mayor of the nation's fourth-largest city in a tight race against Republican businessman Bill King.

Unofficial, final results show the 61-year-old Turner beat King by more than 4,000 votes in Saturday's runoff. Turner's campaign was endorsed by President Barack Obama.

Houston hasn't elected a Republican mayor in more than 30 years.

Mayor Annise Parker was term-limited after six years in office. She's leaving under the disappointment of voters last month rejecting an anti-discrimination ordinance she championed. Parker was Houston's first lesbian mayor.

Turner lost a run for mayor in the 1990s but went on to carry unusual influence as a Democrat in Texas' Republican-controlled Legislature. Turner supported the repealed ordinance that would have established nondiscrimination protections for gay and transgender people.

For close to 40 years, he has served the community as a civil and criminal lawyer. He received his Bachelor of Business Administration Degree from Pan American University, Edinburg, in 1968. And went on to earn a Juris Doctorate from Thurgood Marshall School of Law at Texas Southern University in Houston in 1977. He opened his private practice in the heart of South Dallas, where he served those who needed him most.

Belt, who was also a Dallas Examiner co-

publisher, sat on the board of the National Newspaper Publisher Association, the official Black Press of America and the NNPA Foundation Board. He served as more of a silent partner and advisor, but it was his support that has helped The Dallas Examiner continue to serve the community for almost 30 years.

He was the founder of the Dallas Black Criminal Bar Association - an organization of Black lawyers in the private practice of law in Dallas County. He was a member of the National Bar Association, Texas Bar Association, J.L. Turner Legal Association and the Inns of Court.

In September, he received the Living Legends award from J.L. Turner Legal Association.

As a well-respected leader in the community and activist, he also served the community by offering his words of wisdom and years of knowledge and experience. During the early 2000s, he co-hosted Dallas Examiner Live on KNOM Radio. He previously sat on the Texas Southern University Board of Regents in Houston, Dallas Area Rapid Transit Board and the Texas Rural Foundation Board.

Baylor's Coleman Wins Biletnikoff As Nation's Top Receiver


(AP) - Baylor's Corey Coleman has won the Biletnikoff Award, given to the nation's outstanding receiver.

Coleman is the first Baylor player to win the award, presented at the College Football Awards on Thursday night. Laquon Treadwell of Ole Miss was also a finalist.

Coleman, a junior, had 74 receptions for 1,363 yards and 20 touchdowns. It was his second straight season with more than 1,000 yards receiving.

Other players from the Big 12 to win the award include Michael Crabtree, who won back-to-back awards in 2007-08 for Texas Tech, and Justin Blackmon, who also won two straight years in 2010-11 for Oklahoma State.

Alabama's Amari Cooper was the 2014 winner.


