



DALLAS CITY COUNCIL UNANIMOUSLY VOTED FOR CITY MANAGER A.C. GONZALEZ

Dallas City Council has unanimously voted A.C. Gonzalez for city manager. Gonzalez was the favorite of three candidates into the January 21 vote.

After the vote, Gonzalez said he was honored by the council's discussion and decision. "This vote of confidence in me is an indication in your belief that positive change can and will be achieved from within," Gonzalez said.

"I'm confident that we can get started on those changes sooner, not later."

Dallas City Manager A.C. Gonzalez has built a strong record in municipal management for more than 28 years, with 14 years serving the City of Dallas as an Assistant City Manager. During his

tenure, he has spearheaded projects that have changed the face of Dallas, including the development of the Omni Dallas Convention Center Hotel, management of the Love Field Modernization Program, negotiations of the Dallas Stars Reunion Arena lease, which brought the professional sports franchise to Dallas.

The Dallas City Council appointed Gonzalez as the Interim City Manager on June 26, 2013. As interim city manager, Gonzalez was responsible for the daily operations of the municipal organization. He manages a staff of approximately 13,000 employees and a budget of nearly 3 billion.
