NAACP Challenges Voter Suppression at 103rd Annual Convention

The NAACP took a principled stand against voter suppression at their 103rd Annual Convention last week in Houston, Texas. The theme "Your Power, Your Decision – VOTE" was on full display as delegates heard from Vice President Biden and Governor Mitt Romney and learned about attacks on the right to vote in states across the country. An estimated 8,000 NAACP delegates, members and supporters traveled from around the country to represent their local units and set the NAACP's policy agenda for the coming year.

EASY SUMMER RECIPE...THAT'S GREEN

HONEY GLAZED GRILLED PLUMS



INGREDIENTS

4 firm plums, halved and pitted (about 3/4 pound)

6 tablespoons honey
3 cups vanilla frozen yogurt

PREPARATION

Grill the plums: Heat a grill to medium. Toss plums and 2 tablespoons honey in a large bowl. Liberally brush a grill rack with oil. Grill the plums, flesh side down, on the rack until lightly browned — about 3 minutes. Turn and grill on skin side until plums soften and are warmed through — 2 to 3 more minutes. Serve 2 plum halves with 3/4 cup yogurt immediately.



The Dallas Independent School District's Food and Child Nutrition Services, in conjunction with the Texas Department of Agriculture, provides free meals to Dallas children and youth, ages one through 18, through the Summer Food Service Program. The Summer Food Service Program will run from Monday through Friday. The program began June 4 and will run through August 17. The program's goal is to ensure that youth throughout Dallas will not go without proper nutrition during the summer months. Dallas ISD students who attend summer school will receive free breakfasts through the Breakfast in the Classroom program. Approximately 50,000 meals will be prepared for distribution daily. In this psalm of lament, David finds himself in a very difficult situation. This psalm may have been composed during the time of David's flight from jealous King Saul. David may have been hiding in a cave of Adullam, being surrounded by many enemies who were against him. In a desperate situation, David cries out to the Lord to

deliver him from his enemies. In verses 1-2, feeling that God had abandoned and forgotten about him, David raises four "how long" questions - "How long wilt thou forget me, O LORD? for ever? how long wilt thou hide thy face from me? How long shall I take counsel in my soul, having sorrow in my heart daily? how long shall mine enemy be exalted over me?" These questions were really designed to prompt God to answer his prayer.

Being in a very troubled situation, David's heart was continually

filled with agony. Seemingly deserted by God, David felt that his enemies were victorious over him (v. 2). Having acknowledged that he felt forsaken by the Lord as he underwent this great ordeal, David in verses 3-4 cries out to the Lord to deliver him from his situation. David was in grave danger, and being in grave danger he was afraid to even go to sleep because he was afraid that his enemy would take his life. However, he requested that the Lord would protect and give him rest. In the midst of a grave situa-

tion, David rested on God's unfailing love and mercy. David knew that only God could safeguard him (v. 5).

God was truly David's salvation and He is ours too!

determined to praise

the Lord, for verse 6

says - "I will sing unto

the LORD, because He

hath dealt bountifully

with me." Because the

Barack Obama's Campaign Spending and the Black Press

President Obama inherited a country in severe economic recession, a real estate market that was belly up, and an auto industry that was on the verge of collapse--- G.M.'s shares had tumbled to \$3.36 per share. In his first post-election press conference Obama called the automakers "the backbone of American manufacturing" as thousands of auto industry employees belonged to unions that are a part of the democratic base.

The financial "bailouts" of 2009 (\$17.4 billion for General Motors and Chrysler, \$6 billion for GMAC, \$1.5 billion for Chrysler Financial) while great for those companies and the many others that received stimulus aid, had no visual and significant impact on the Black community.

So many African Americans remain disillusioned about the benefits of the Obama presidency, and the financially depressed Black Press wonders why it has been overlooked.

The Black Press is the undisputed bedrock of Barack Obama's political base. NNPA member newspapers carry positive stories about President Barack Obama and his administration on a weekly basis. Barack Obama lives because of the Black Press and the Black Church and is now in a position to utilize their services and expertise and provide a financial stimulus to

this fledgling entity. A budget of \$20 million should adequately serve to inform, educate and influence the African American vote--which is a significant part of the democratic base.

While it is true that African Americans represent 13.6% of the US population, and do not possess the numbers to elect a US President on their own, it is also true that African Americans are often the market that makes the difference in the bottom lines of many corporations. Equally true, is that they provide the margin of victory in many local and national elections.

African American political and economic power did not rise from the dust of slavery without powerful forces working together, namely, the Black Church, and the Black Press. Without the combined efforts of these institutions, there would be no Barack Obama sitting in the White House today. His victory is a testimony to the advocacy of the stalwarts in the Black Church, (Martin Luther King, Adam Clayton Powell, Jesse Jackson, Malcolm X, Al Sharpton), and the Black Press, (John Russworm, Frederick Douglass, John Henry Murphy, Sr, Robert S. Abbott, John Sengstacke, C B Powell, etc). Past NNPA Chairman Danny Bakewell Sr., a long time Civil Rights advocate and publisher of the Los Angles Sentinel, reminds all who will listen that there is neither a Black politician nor corporate CEO

who has attained his/her position without the help of the Black Press. Countless speakers addressing the organization acknowledge that they would not be in their current position if it were not for the Black Press.

Therefore, it makes me wonder why the Obama campaign organizers cannot grasp the importance of the Black Press in their campaign spending. Following is a scenario that could cause Obama to lose the elections.

The voter ID campaign can cause Barack Obama to lose his margin of victory in several states.

While there may be nothing wrong with being required to have a voter ID, the Black Press and the Black Church must address this issue and provide information and encouragement to the Black community to overcome it.

College students, African Americans, and especially the elderly, were unstoppable in getting to the voting booths in 2008 because they were determined to participate in an historic election.

Without a valid voter ID many of those same voters will be turned away from the polls. The motivation that was there in 2008 is no longer there for the 2012 election. The miracle has already happened. A Black man is in the White House.. The question now is, how do we keep him there? In face of strong opposition, Obama must attend to this segment of his base which is

influenced and encouraged by the Black Press and the Black Church.

The National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA) represents Black newspapers across the US. The organization has member papers in every state, reaching readers in cities, towns, metro areas, villages and hamlets across the country. Some publishers are proprietors and affiliates of local radio stations. The organization has an in-house advertising placement facility thereby maintaining control of placements and insuring that the advertising messages are evenly and equitably distributed.

Of the \$740 million spent in 2008 by the Obama campaign, \$235 million was spent on broadcast advertising. Approximately \$1 million was spent with 200 NNPA newspapers across the country, averaging one (1) ad per newspaper, which is tokenism at best. This year it is estimated that his campaign spending will exceed \$1 billion.

The Black Press needs to be encouraged to get Barack Obama re-elected. There needs to be a national campaign of advertising and editorials relating to the importance of the voter ID and going to the polls and vote. This is a critical issue and no other medium will address it as diligently and as effective as the Black Press. While the Black Press does its part in providing editorial support, it needs compensation to do its job effectively.

In the latest of a series of recent deals, Wells Fargo & Co. has agreed to pay more than \$175 million to settle allegations it discriminated against minorities by unfairly selling them high-cost subprime home loans during and after the housing bubble, federal officials said Thursday.

San Francisco-based Wells Fargo, the third-largest bank in Central Florida based on deposits, said it agreed to the deal to resolve the case and avoid costly litigation with the U.S. Justice Department. The bank denied the allegations, which it noted were based on a sample of 2004-09 loans sold by its independent mortgage brokers.

The latest settlement, which is pending court approval, came six weeks after SunTrust Banks Inc., the largest

bank in Central Florida, agreed to pay \$21 million to settle similar allegations of racial bias in mortgage lending. Seven months ago, Bank of America Corp., the region's second-largest bank, agreed to a \$335 million settlement -- the largest to date in the government's campaign against home-loan bias.





David Wu, (D-Ore), the one wearing the tiger suit, resigned FOLLOWING ALLEGATIONS of assaulting a campaign donor's teenage daughter, followed by a lot of noise amid reports of "odd behavior". A polite term. And of course, we all remember Rep. Anthony Weiner, (D-NY), who is married, but sent photos of himself to women online.
