### NAACP Statement on Resignation of McKinney Police Officer Eric Casebolt

The police officer who was videotaped slamming a teenage girl to the ground and raising his gun towards others during an incident at a Texas pool has resigned. Cpl. Eric Casebolt's resignation comes a day after hundreds of protesters marched near the pool in McKinney, Texas where the incident occurred last weekend.

From Cornell William Brooks, NAACP President & CEO: "The children and families of McKinney, Texas deserve a police department that is committed to stopping crime and preserving justice, not a department that tolerates the use of excessive force."

To protect any community, law enforcement officials must respect that community. The resignation of Cpl. Eric Casebolt is a good first step, but hardly the last. The NAACP will continue working with community members and law enforcement to ensure that no one, especially the young people of McKinney, are ever again the victims of excessive force, racial profiling and police brutality. We join the community in wrapping our arms around these young people as they heal from the physical and mental scars this incident may have caused. They are our future, and their lives matter."

On Monday, June 8th,

NAACP leaders from Texas, including Garland Branch President Ricky McNeal, NAACP First Vice President and National Board Member Bob Lydia and Arlington Branch President Alisa Simmons, met with McKinney Police Department Chief Greg Conley. The meeting was called to discuss the concerns McKinney residents have about the aggressive police actions recently demonstrated against minors at a local pool party. During the two-hour meeting, the NAACP made several requests on the community's behalf.

### Dallas Superintendent Overrides Board, Fires 3 Principals

By The Associated Press - The superintendent of the Dallas school district has fired three principals despite a school board vote to keep them. The principals are Anna Brining of the Rosemont elementary and middle schools, Joy Morris of Wilmer-Hutchinson Elementary School and Dinnah Escanilla of North Dallas High School. The Dallas Morning News (<http://bit.ly/1FOKWH5>) reported.

An attorney who represents all three principals said two will appeal the decision and that the other didn't want him to speak publicly about her job. Superintendent Mike Miles declined to comment on his decision, which a district spokesman said was a personnel matter. School board members were told Monday that the choice to fire the principals was based on professional leadership concerns.

Escanilla defended her job performance during her nearly two decades with the district. "I was a teacher, instructional specialist, and assistant principal," she said in an email Monday. "North Dallas was my first assignment as a principal." She added that academic performance has improved under her leadership at the school.

Board member Lew Blackburn, who has been on it since 2001, said he couldn't recall another instance when a superintendent overruled the board in a similar situation. The board had voted 5-4 to keep the principals when the superintendent asked them to "nonrenew" the principals' contract.

"Right now, it kind of looks like we're at odds with each other, and I think it should not be that way," Blackburn said. The superintendent has the authority to hire and fire employees without board approval. The Dallas school district is the state's second largest district, with around 160,000 students.

### Abbott Signs Border Security Package Into Law

(AP) - Gov. Greg Abbott has signed into law an \$800 million border security package that will mean more state troopers, cameras and a spy plane to patrol Texas' 1,200-mile border with Mexico.

The Republican made border security an emergency item, fast-tracking proposals on it through the GOP-controlled Legislature during the 140-day session that ended last week.

Abbott signed the law Tuesday, during a ceremony at the Department of Public Safety's regional headquarters in Houston.

It should accelerate the hiring of 250 additional state troopers who will patrol the border, replacing National Guard troops deployed there last summer by Abbott's predecessor, Gov. Rick Perry.

Abbott also signed bills establishing a child sex trafficking prevention unit, toughening punishments for convicted human traffickers and increasing state funding for a border prosecution unit.

### "THE PSALMIST'S URGENT CALL FOR GOD'S JUDGMENT"

#### PSALM 94:1-23

The psalm before us can be labeled as a psalm of lament, wherein the psalmist is pleading for the Lord to take vengeance against the wicked. The Lord should be sought in vengeance against our enemies, for Romans 12:19 says, "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord." Instead of us trying to avenge against our enemies, verses 20-21 of Romans 12 directs us to treat our enemies with kindness, for those verses read: "Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good."

In verses 1-3, the psalmist writes with absolute confidence affirming that vengeance belongs to the Lord and He will judge the wicked, "O God, to whom vengeance belongeth, shew thyself" (v. 1b). As believers, we know that the Lord will avenge the cause of the righteous, and we need not be worried about God's judgment of the wicked because Psalm 37:1-2 states: "Fret not thyself because of evildoers, neither be thou envious against the workers of iniquity. For they shall soon be cut down

like the grass, and wither as the green herb."

In verses 4-7, the psalmist laments the proud way in which the wicked oppressed God's people. They exhibit these vile actions thinking that the Lord is not aware. However, in verses 8-11, the psalmist calls on the wicked to be wise, for the Lord is aware of their oppression of the righteous and God sees and hears everything because He created both the eyes and ears of humans: "Understand, ye brutish among the people: and ye fools, when will ye be wise? He that planted the ear, shall He not hear? He that formed the eye, shall He not see? He that chastiseth the heathen, shall not He correct? He that teacheth man knowledge, shall not He know?" (vv. 8-10).

The psalmist expresses his confidence in the Lord despite the righteous being oppressed by the wicked; because, through being oppressed by the wicked, God is teaching the righteous through adversity (vv. 12-15). Verse 12 states, "Blessed is the man whom thou chastenest, O LORD, and teachest him out of thy law."

Although being oppressed by the wicked, the psalmist gained confidence in the fact that the Lord was his only means of security (vv. 16-19). The psalmist concludes this psalm in triumph, knowing that the Lord will ultimately bring to nought the wicked: "They gather themselves together against the soul of the righteous, and condemn the innocent blood. But the LORD is my defence; and my God is the rock of my refuge. And He shall bring upon them their own iniquity, and shall cut them off in their own wickedness; yea, the LORD our God shall cut them off" (vv. 20-23).

## Jay-Z and Beyoncé are Following a Rich Tradition

Hip-hop culture is about transformation. It is more than a global genre of music. Hip-hop is a transcendent cultural phenomena that speaks to the soul, mind, body and spirit of what it means to dare to change the world into a better place. Hip-hop is not just about acquiring funds or "stacking paper." It is also about giving back. I have personally been a long term advocate for the unbridled intellectual genius and social consciousness of hip-hop.

So when I heard that recently Jay-Z and Beyoncé travelled together to Baltimore, Md. in the wake of the massive "Black Lives Matter" protests, I was not surprised. In fact, I give them both a big thumbs-up salute in gratitude for their leadership example. The impact of the injustice of the horrific police killing of Freddie Gray was profound not only in

Baltimore, but also across the nation.

They did not wait for a "cooling off" period before going to the scene of the protests. Jay and Bey also spent some quality time consoling Freddie Gray's family. Giving back sometimes involves more than financial contributions. Taking sincere acts of solidarity and empathy with those who cry out for equal justice is also a meaningful expression of caring and lending one's public brand to support the demand for justice.

One of the reasons why I believe that the combined creative talent of this gifted couple will continue to soar with career success is that they both believe in giving back. They give back substantially to their communities in New York, in Texas and throughout the world. From assisting global Red Cross efforts to helping the United Nations to provide safe clean drinking water to millions of people in Africa, Jay-Z and Beyoncé continue their transformative philanthropic campaigns.

Of course whenever public icons such as Jay and Bey attempt to help make a difference for besieged and underserved communities, there will always be a cynical group of "player haters." But all of the negative responses to the

goodwill actions of Jay and Bey will in no way be successful in tarnishing their righteous acts of helping others.

I well remember when the Godfather of hip-hop, Russell Simmons, was joined on New York City in 2001 by P. Diddy, Sister Souljah, Queen Latifah, Jay-Z, Will and Jada Smith, and many other hip-hop icons to establish the Hip-Hop Summit Action Network (HSAN) as a nonprofit advocacy organization. The artists decided that the theme of HSAN would be "Taking back responsibility" for the empowerment of families and communities in America and internationally.

Jay-Z and Beyoncé have helped HSAN immeasurably over years to register millions of young people to vote and to encourage Get-Out-The-Vote (GOTV) programs in many cities and states. Again, it was not surprising to hear Jay-Z's latest rap featuring lyrics about the unjust deaths of Freddie Gray, Michael Brown and Trayvon Martin. In classic Jay-Z style, he poetically said, "'You know when I work, I ain't your slave, right? You know I ain't shucking and jiving and high-fiving, and you know this ain't back in the days, right? Well I can't tell how the way they killed Freddie Gray, right? Shot down Mike Brown how they did Tray, right?'

Beyoncé also has a very long list of charities that she supports financially, including the Boys and Girls Clubs of America, Oxfam, UNICEF, Global Poverty Project, and Keep a Child Alive. Yet, probably one of the most private and telling acts that Jay-Z and Beyoncé have done over the past year anonymously was the paying of thousands of dollars for the release from jail bails for the hundreds of persons arrested in Ferguson and in Baltimore who were protesting police brutality.

In the 1960s, Harry Belafonte, Sidney Poitier, James Baldwin, Dick Gregory and many other performing artists and authors would pay the bail money to get hundreds civil rights workers out of jails during the many struggles for equality and justice. Thus, Jay-Z and Beyoncé today are continuing that proud tradition of giving to support the causes of freedom, justice and equality.
