



Rodney King, Beaten by Police, Caused the Greatest Race Riot in Los Angeles, California Succumbs

Police beating Rodney King

(AP) - Just a few months ago, Rodney King was once again the center of attention as the world checked back in on the man whose videotaped beating by police sparked one of the nation's worst race riots.

King had left Los Angeles behind, moving an hour east to a home where neighbors would often hear him splashing in the pool late at night.

The physical and emotional scars from the more than 50 baton blows remained, but King struck an upbeat note on his life.

"America's been good to me after I paid the price and stayed alive through it all," he told The Associated Press. "This part of my life is the easy part now."

But King was found around 5:30 a.m. Sunday at the bottom of the swimming pool at his Rialto, Calif. Home.

His death at age 47 is being treated as an apparent drowning and there are no signs of foul play, but Capt. Randy De Anda said autopsy results would be needed to determine whether drugs or alcohol were a factor.

Dallas Olympics Will Give 4,000 Youth Insight into What It Takes To Be a Champion

Olympic Hopeful Michelle Carter, Gold Medalists Chryste Gaines, Mitch Gaylord, Ryan

Berube Among 26 Olympians Scheduled To Participate Friday, June 22

The City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department has joined with the United States Olympians & Paralympians Southwest in transforming Fair Park's legendary Cotton Bowl into Olympics-styled contests for 4,000 youth in celebration of the upcoming global games and as a kick off to National Park and Recreation Month next month.

Dallas Youth Olympics begins at 9:30 with inspirational music by the Dallas Wind Symphony followed at 9:45 a.m. by the Parade of Athletes. Similar to

the Olympics, youth from the park department's 34 recreation centers and Send A Kid To Camp program will join with youth representing the Mayor's Youth Fitness Initiative, World Fit, St. Phillip's School, Circle of Support and Grand Prairie Boys and Girls Club to walk around the Cotton Bowl with original identifying banners and waving small U.S. Flags.

"As we join with the rest of the world preparing to watch the 2012 Games, we want to showcase our Olympic spirit for our youth Olympics. The

park department is pleased to team up with the U.S. Olympians & Paralympians to inspire and motivate young athletes and perhaps ready them to compete in the 2020 or 2024 Olympics," said Joan Walne, president of the Dallas Park and Recreation Board.

At 10 a.m. Ms. Walne will join with Olympians & Paralympians Association national and local representatives and former and current Olympians for the opening ceremony. The Dallas Games begin at 10:30 a.m. and continue until the closing remarks at 12:45 p.m.

Youth Summer Camp Performance Musical Procession and Live Theatre Performance

Friday – July 6th, 2012. 5:30-6:30 p.m.

The Oak Cliff Cultural Center is excited to present the culminating performance of this year's Youth Summer Camp. Big Thought and Cara Mia Theatre Co. have collaborated with the Oak Cliff Cultural Center to present a multi-disciplinary project focused on Enhancing Community through the Arts. The group will present a parade-like procession on the 200 block of West Jefferson that will finish up with scene performances at the historic Texas Theatre, located at 231 W. Jefferson Blvd., Dallas, TX 75208.

Cara Mia Theatre Co., under the direction of David Lozano, has assembled a team of artist teachers to lead a summer program focusing on the universality of community through different disciplines. Students will perform music they have helped compose with musician S'Ankh Rasa on instruments that they create in the camp. Seasoned dancer Leslie Hale will coordinate the dances that will lead the group up Jefferson Boulevard and into the Texas Theatre. The visual aspect of the procession will include giant puppets created by the students under the leadership of Frida Lozano and with contributions from visiting artists Arturo Donjuan and Alfredo Calderon.

Intercultural expert Ernest McMillan serves as the development guide for the community outreach portion of the program. Working closely with a selected leadership team of students, McMillan ties

the artistic exploration of the camp into the relationships the students build in their communities. Students explore culture through a series of interviews they conduct with a wide array of community figures. The group learns about the differences of other cultures through these interviews, and at the same time reveals the connection between communities through artistic examinations. This process concludes with a festive march on Jefferson Boulevard that integrates music, dance and puppetry; a powerful introduction to the set of student-written scenes to be performed onstage at the historic Texas Theatre.

According to David Lozano, "This program presents a very powerful model for living that this group can lean on for the rest of their lives. It shows that you can figure out who you are and not be afraid of confronting your identity, being yourself. And this is all done through art!" The summer camp is sponsored by Big Thought and presented by Cara Mia Theatre Company in conjunction with the Oak Cliff Cultural Center.

Located in a historic storefront in the vibrant commercial district of Jefferson Boulevard in Oak Cliff, the Oak Cliff Cultural Center opened its doors in August 2010. The facility was purchased and renovated by the City of Dallas through the 2003 Bond Program to function as a permanent City-owned arts center where residents and

visitors of Oak Cliff could experience a variety of arts and cultural programs. The 5,000 sq. ft. storefront features a visual arts gallery and a dance studio/rehearsal space. The Oak Cliff Cultural Center is open Tuesday – Friday, 3:00-9:00 p.m., and Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

The City of Dallas Office of Cultural Affairs (OCA) works to enhance the vitality of the City and the quality of life for all Dallas citizens by creating an environment wherein arts and cultural organizations can thrive so that people of all ages can enjoy opportunities for creative expressions and the celebration of our community's multicultural heritage. 

What a mighty prophetic psalm we have before us. Psalm 9 forecasts a time when Christ will be the earthly ruler on the Millennium throne as Psalm 8 anticipated. Although Christ at His first coming was "a little lower than the angels" (Psalm 8:5), there will come a day when all things will be under the feet of the Son (Psalm 8:6). During the Millennium reign of Christ, righteousness and justice will be administered correctly, and there will be peace upon the earth, Amen! There will not be peace until the Prince of peace comes!

This wonderful psalm is ascribed to David and it is addressed "To the Chief Musician upon Muth-laben, a Psalm of David." The word "Muth-laben"

"A PSALM OF GREAT PROPHETIC EXPECTATION" PSALM 9:1-20

may mean "death for the son." Many scholars advance that David had in mind the death of Bathsheba's son or the death of Goliath. They also suggest that David was referring to the death of the first born of Egypt when the children of Israel were emancipated from Egypt. Psalm 9 begins with David's resolve to praise God with His whole being (wholeheartedly) and to tell forth God's great wonders (v. 1). We need to rejoice and sing praises to the majestic name of God (v. 2).

God is indeed wondrous and we should join David in telling forth His great works in our lives. Can you think of any great wonders God has performed in your life? Do you tell others about how He opened up a Red Sea in your life and provided a way for you when you were in a crisis situation? Have you told others

about how He is sustaining you in this wilderness, supplying your every need? Have you told others that He is your constant protector, your pillar of cloud by day and pillar of fire by night? Have you thanked Him for the assurance of knowing that your ultimate destiny will be in His presence? What a mighty God we serve and we ought to bless His Holy and infinite name!

In verses 3-6, David praised God because He will execute judgment correctly; that is, God will vindicate the cause of the righteous (vs. 3-4). Even the enemies of David will be dealt with and ultimately defeated, for even their memory will be destroyed (vs. 5-6).

Because the Lord will judge in righteousness, the needs of the afflicted and the oppressed will be administered righteously (vs. 7-10). Knowing that God is a refuge in a time of trouble, one can truly

trust God (v. 10). In verses 11-12, the psalmist admonishes the people to sing praises to God. Having disclosed how God in the past delivered the afflicted, David now calls on God to defend his cause against his enemies (v. 13).

As a result of God's deliverance, David will praise God in the gates of the Daughter of Zion, the tabernacle in Jerusalem (v. 14). Because of David's absolute trust in the Lord, David was assured that the wicked and their plans will be destroyed (vs. 15-16). The destination of the wicked is the grave (v. 17); whereas, the expectation of the poor and afflicted will be realized (v. 18). Finally in verses 19-20, the psalmist closes with a prayer, expressing that the Lord would cause feeble mankind to fear God's judgment, knowing that mortal man is only human.

Church Pledges 10 Percent of Offerings to Community

Traditionally, when referring to churches, the figure of 10 percent refers to how much of an individual's income they are required to give back to the church.

Yet the Miami Gardens-based Immanuel Temple has expanded that concept by promising to donate 10 percent of the church's proceeds to charitable donations.

According to Immanuel Temple's founder and senior pastor, Rev. John F. White, the church is

"tithing back to the community."

"For me, it is a mandate from God to spread the love of Jesus Christ in a tangible way and this is our effort to do that," White explained.

Immanuel Temple held its inaugural service on Easter Sunday, April 8th at the auditorium of the Carol City Senior High School. The church continues to meet at the high school and White estimates that they have over 300 members already.

To ensure that the church meets its 10 percent donation goals, Immanuel Temple relies

upon a budget that allots roughly 15 percent of all proceeds are to be saved, 85 percent are to be used for the operating budget and the remaining 10 percent is for charitable donations.

Pamela Hines, was one of the church's first members, praised Immanuel Temple's "community tithing" policy.

I am very honored to be apart of a congregation that gives back," she said. "Most churches take and give nothing to the surrounding community where they are located and in that alone Immanuel Temple will be

different."

To ensure that there is transparency, White says that church leaders will report the budget to the entire church in quarterly meetings.

Recently, the church had donated \$1000 each to three local schools.

According to White, "Our next effort is where we're going to buy school uniforms for 2100 kids who are on free and reduced lunch who go to Golden Glades Elementary School, Parkway Elementary School, Scott Lake Elementary and Nathan B. Young Elementary."



(AP) - Forbes has released its list of the 100 highest paid athletes, and boxer Floyd Mayweather Jr., nicknamed "Money," is No. 1.

Mayweather, made \$85 million for two fights last year.

Boxer Manny Pacquiao is second on the magazine's list at \$62 million from earnings and endorsements.

Pacquiao lost his WBO welterweight title to Timothy Bradley earlier this month.

Tiger Woods, No. 1 on the list since 2001, made \$59.4 million to place third.

LeBron James of the Miami Heat is fourth (\$53 million). He is one of 13 basketball players on the list.

Tennis star Roger Federer is fifth at \$52.7

million.

Thirty football players made the top 100, with Peyton Manning tops among them at No. 10. The Denver Broncos' new quarterback made \$42.4 million during his last season with the Indianapolis Colts, even though he sat out the entire season while recovering from a neck injury.

New York Yankees third baseman Alex Rodriguez was tops among baseball players and No. 18 overall with \$33 million.

Two women, both tennis players, made the list. Maria Sharapova (\$27.9 million) comes in at No. 26, and Li Na (\$18.4 million).

Baseball's Roger Clemens Acquitted of All Charges

(AP) — Roger Clemens was acquitted Monday on all charges that he obstructed and lied to Congress in denying he used performance-enhancing drugs to extend his long career as one of the greatest and most-decorated pitchers in base-

ball history.

Fierce on the pitching mound in his playing days, Clemens was quietly emotional after the verdict was announced. "I'm very thankful," he said, choking up as he spoke. "It's been a hard five years," said the pitcher, who was retried

after an earlier prosecution ended in a mistrial.

This case was lengthy, but the deliberations were relatively brief. Jurors returned their verdict after less than 10 hours over several days. The outcome ended a 10-week trial that capped the government's investigation of the pitcher known as "The Rocket" for the fastball that he retained into his 40s. He won seven Cy Young Awards, emblematic of the league's best pitcher each year in a 24-year career with the Red Sox, Yankees, Blue Jays and Astros.

The verdict was the latest blow to the government's legal pursuit of athletes accused of illicit drug use.





My Day: "Shackle" Sneakers


I will never forget it. I was riding in the cab of my Dad's pickup truck the first time I saw black men in shackles in a chain gang on the side of the road picking up trash. It was shocking to visually witness the view, even though I had seen pictures of black men in shackles and worse. When you are little, you wonder how did this happen? What did they do? Do they have little girls?

On Monday, June, 18, 2012, Adidas announced on their facebook page that they were pulling their new "shackle" style sneakers from the market.

They have apologized if they offended anyone by the design and "we are withdrawing our plans to make them available in the marketplace". That is substantially not enough. It is equally as important that your voice be and remain resounding on this subject. The shoes debuted on the facebook page ahead of its actual release in August, around the time school opens. Normally, an

early release is for anticipation. Adidas further states that "the design is nothing more than the designer unique take on fashion and has nothing to do with slavery". "Unique" is not the correct word. "Copy" is a perfect fit. I say it is not enough because ad agencies promote and propel sales of new products. Ad agencies are handsomely paid. Before the early released promos and the actual announcements to the marketplace, there is the budget, the designer's approved works, the mounts of study, logs of research, situation room of paperwork, containers of employees, beta sites, etc.; have taken place and the expected profits, Christmas bonus and private jet trips to the superbowl factured in. My point is a launch of a new product in a profitable corporation is an enormous task and million of dollars upfront.

We all know that fashion repeats itself. The key word here is repeat! We all have something that once was in style. So, what is Adidas and their design team really telling African Americans? What is the ultimate message here? You were once in slavery... so let's do it again? On facebook, critics have had some choice language about the designed fashion and the thousands of comments have been both positive
