## Southern Baptist Elects First Black President

(AP) - The largest U.S. Protestant denomination chose its first black president on Tuesday, June 19, 2012, an historic election for the predominately-white religious group as it seeks to better reflect the diversity of the country and its membership.

Pastor Fred Luter, a New Orleans pastor and civic leader, ran unopposed for the top post in the 167-year-old Southern Baptist Convention, which counts a growing number of minorities among its 16 million members.

His election to a one-year term was met by thunderous applause and a standing ovation from the 7,000 Southern Baptists attending the convention's annual meeting in New Orleans.

Luter, 55, was born and raised in the city, which is also home to the church he rebuilt into the denomination's largest congregation in Louisiana after Hurricane Katrina devastated it in 2005.

The pastor said he hoped his election would spur more appointments for people of color to leadership positions in the convention.

## Director appointed for new UT Arlington Student Money Management Center

The University of Texas at Arlington is pleased to announce the appointment of Ms. Shakeela J. Hunter, formerly of The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, as the University's first director of student financial literacy.

Hunter will help shape the University's new Student Money Management Center, which is aimed at ensuring that students have the opportunity to learn how to manage budgets and debt, save, prevent identity theft and plan for retirement – all before they earn their college degree.

The initiative is part of UT Arlington's ongoing efforts to ensure student success. It also follows a 2011 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board rule directing general academic institutions to

offer students training in personal financial literacy and provide students the knowledge and skills they need to make important financial decisions.

Concerns about college costs and student debt loads have increased in recent years. Nationally, the average college student graduates with about \$25,000 in loan debt. The average debtload for UT Arlington students, however, is about \$18,800. About two-thirds of UT Arlington students borrow money to pay for college.

The addition of a student financial literacy director is among the many initiatives the University has undertaken to help students afford their college education. UT Arlington has not increased tuition and fees or room and board for the 2012-2013 academic year. About two thirds of students receive some form of financial aid to help pay for college, and two-thirds hold at least one job while attending college.

Hunter helped launch UI's University Student Money Management Center in the Student Financial Services office

"I'm passionate about students and helping them stay in school," Hunter said. "My hope is that they will get a quality education and graduate with as little debt as possible. I want them to be educated about finances before they ever have to worry about their credit score."

Hunter earned her undergraduate degree in finance from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and her Master of Business Administration from the University of Phoenix.

Mrs. Kelly Davis, UT Arlington's Vice President for Business Affairs and Controller, said Hunter will be an excellent resource for students.

"We are fortunate to have Shakeela on our team, and we look forward to working with her to offer our students support in managing the costs of their college education."

Psalm 10 has somewhat been ascribed to David as its author because of the close link that it has with Psalm 9. As David opens this lament psalm in verses 1-2, he gives a vivid description of the wicked, and complains to the Lord about seemingly being unconcerned about the trouble of the oppressed. As David, we complain indirectly about the Lord's interest in the affairs of this life; however, we need not complain about how things are being carried out, for God is still controlling the events of time and when the time comes, He will straight-

en things out.

A prophet of old by the name of Habakkuk was also perplexed about the prevailing condition of evil and God's seemingly unconcern about evil in his day (Habakkuk 1:2-4). Habakkuk asked "how long shall I cry, and thou wilt not hear!" God responded in Habakkuk 1:5-11 and said that He was doing something about it as He states "for I will work a work in your days which ye will not believe, though it be told you." Ultimately, the "just shall live by faith" (Habakkuk 2:4).

The wicked in verses 2-3 are characterized as being proud and boastful, even oppressing the weak. However, in God's good timing, the wicked will be severely dealt with (Revelation 20:11-15). Further, the


wicked is so self-confident and is excessively haughty, having really no space for God or God's laws (vs. 4-5). The wicked feels strongly that he can exist without God and attain happiness (v. 6). With such a haughty heart, the wicked speaks words that are destructive (v. 7).

In verses 8-11, the destructive behavior of the wicked is revealed, for the wicked viciously attacks the helpless. The strong imagery of the wicked lurking as a lion and as a fisherman drawing the innocent in discloses that the aim of the wicked is to attack. The wicked seems even to devise in their hearts that God does not care, nor does He care about the righteous (v. 13). Confronted with this grave situation the

psalmist cries out vehemently for God to help in the plight of the helpless (v. 14).

The psalmist then earnestly requested that God would punish the wicked (v. 15). In essence, the psalmist is calling on God to destroy the power of the wicked. In verse 16, the Lord does care for the plight of the helpless, for David confidently said - "The Lord is King for ever and ever: the heathen are perished out of the earth." In verses 16-18, David expresses confidence that his prayer is heard, for the Lord will avenge the cause of the afflicted and He will destroy the wicked who oppresses.

II. Jesus Is Coming Again To Judge All.

On Mars Hill, Paul told the heathen philosophers that God will judge the world by Jesus Christ, and he gave as assurance of this the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Evidence is overwhelming that

God raise Christ from the dead! Therefore we have great assurance that the day of judgment is coming! (Acts 17:30, 31)

### From a Biblical Perspective: Purposes of Christ's Coming

Paul also said to those on Mars Hill that Jesus will judge the world in righteousness. Jesus also said this when he said he will judge by his word (John 12:48). The righteousness by which all will be judged is that standard of what God says is right as revealed in the Bible.

"For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ" (Rom. 14:10b)

There is a story that says a woman was driving a team of horses to a wagon and the horses were running fast and she was unable to stop them. They were about to go down a long hill. A man ran out and caught a line that was on the team and pulled them into a ditch and stopped

them. Two years later the woman that was driving the horses was tried and convicted for a capital crime, and the judge sentenced her to death. When the judge announced the sentence the woman suddenly realized he was the man who had stopped the horses. She screamed, "Judge, you cannot do this to me two years ago you saved my life, and today you are sentencing me to die."

He responded, "Lady, two years ago, I was your savior; today I am your judge!" When Christ returns he will not return to offer lost people another chance to be saved. He will then be our judge! "So Christ was once offered to bear the

sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation" (Heb. 9:28)

"Without sin" of the foregoing does not imply that the first time Jesus came he had sin. The first time he came he dealt with sin by offering himself for our sins. The second time he comes he will come without having anything to do about sin. He will come as our judge!


