DONALD STERLING BANNED FOR LIFE BY THE NBA

(AP) - NBA Commissioner Adam Silver delivered the swiftest, strongest penalty he could, then called on NBA owners to force Los Angeles Clippers owner Donald Sterling to sell the team for making racist comments that hurt the league.

Sterling, 80, is banned for life from any association with the league or the Clippers, and was fined \$2.5 million - the maximum allowable under the NBA constitution. If three-fourths of the other 29 owners agree to Silver's recommendation, Sterling will be forced to sell the team he has owned since 1981.

Chris Paul, the Clippers' All-Star point guard and the president of the players' union, issued a brief statement before leading Los Angeles against the Warriors in Game 5 of their tied playoff series.

"In response to today's ruling by the NBA and Commissioner Adam Silver, my teammates and I are in agreement with his decision," Paul said. "We appreciate the strong leadership from Commissioner Silver and he has our full support."

Sterling's comments - which were recorded by his girlfriend and released by TMZ on Saturday - harmed the league, Silver said. Sponsors were threatening to abandon the NBA, and criticism was coming from fans on social media and even the White House.

Silver said the ban applied only to Sterling, and there had been no discussions about whether he could sell to a family member.

The fine will be donated to organizations dedicated to anti-discrimination and tolerance efforts, Silver said. Sterling, with an estimated net worth of about \$2 billion, did not comment, though Silver said he did not apologize for his remarks. Silver said Sterling confirmed that he was the person on the recording.

For Sterling to be forced to sell, 75 percent of NBA clubs would have to vote in favor of such a move. That means if 29 teams vote, Silver would have to get 22 yes votes.

DALLAS ISD SCHOOL YEAR WILL END ON JUNE 6 AFTER TEA APPROVES WAIVER FOR MISSED DAY

The Dallas Independent School District's 2013-2014 school year will end on June 6 after the Texas Education Agency approved its request to not make-up a mandatory school day missed due to inclement weather. Dallas ISD was notified of the decision April 29. Texas requires that school districts provide 180 days of instruction. Dallas ISD schools have been closed three days due to inclement weather this school year. The district had built two inclement weather days into its calendar, meaning it faced the prospect of extending the school year by one day to make up for an additional missed day March 3. Dallas ISD's request to waive the third missed day was approved. This notice will also be available at www.dallasisd.org.


He served two years in the U.S. Army and earned an honorable discharge.

"From the Desk of a Layman" Creation - Genesis 1:1-31

In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth. And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep.

Creation shows us the absolute beginning of the temporal and material world.

This tells us that God created the original heaven and earth from nothing and verse 2 clarifies the fact that when it came from our creator's hand, this mass was without form, and void, unformed and without any kind of life.

What has happened so far?

These two (2) verses mean everything to creation.

First of all God did not make the statement in the first verse, Moses made that statement, not God. Even though God was the creator, and did do what verse one (1) said He done.

What most people do not understand is the fact that all Hebrew writers always use a summation statement, and then go on to tell how it was done. Moses was a Hebrew writer who was writing about the beginning, so naturally he would do what Hebrews do in this case.

Many people have decided that millions of years passed between verse one (1) and verse two (2). Not so, Moses started with verse two (2) to explain from the beginning how ~ oddid w hat He did, and how He did it.

There is no evidence in the Hebrew text that many years of evolutionary development or a gap of time between verse 1 and verse 2. The Genesis account of creation refutes atheism, pantheism, polytheism, and evolution, because the name (Elohim) is used in the creation because the name Elohim which means God is sin-

gular, and cannot be duplicated.

It is better if all teachers of the Bible would take Hebrew and Greek at some point in time at some seminary or Bible College. The term "Tohu Wabohu", which means "unformed and unfilled". The King James Version translated Tohu Wabohu as VOID, and that alone have caused a lot of people to come with the ideas of their own. Especially this one, "God created the world and SATAN came down and destroyed the earth and God had to remake the world.

When has God ever let Satan destroy anything that He made? God would not let him destroy Adam, or anything that He made, and the reason why he is not still Lucifer is because of his Covetousness. 
"A Life Well Lived" Sister Tommie A. Pullam


