Paul Quinn College President Michael Sorrell Named One of World's Greatest Leaders by Fortune Magazine

The annual list honors influencers in the areas of education, science, philanthropy, technology and business who are developing ground-breaking approaches to meet today's challenges in their respective fields.

Sorrell has served as the President of Paul Quinn College for eleven years. Under his leadership, the school has become one of the most innovative small colleges in America and has become a model for urban higher education by focusing on academic rigor, experiential learning, and entrepreneurship.

"Thank you, Fortune magazine for recognizing the impact of our work at Paul Quinn College. The idea that our quest to end poverty could result in my inclusion on this list is both humbling and inspiring," said Michael Sorrell, President, Paul Quinn College.

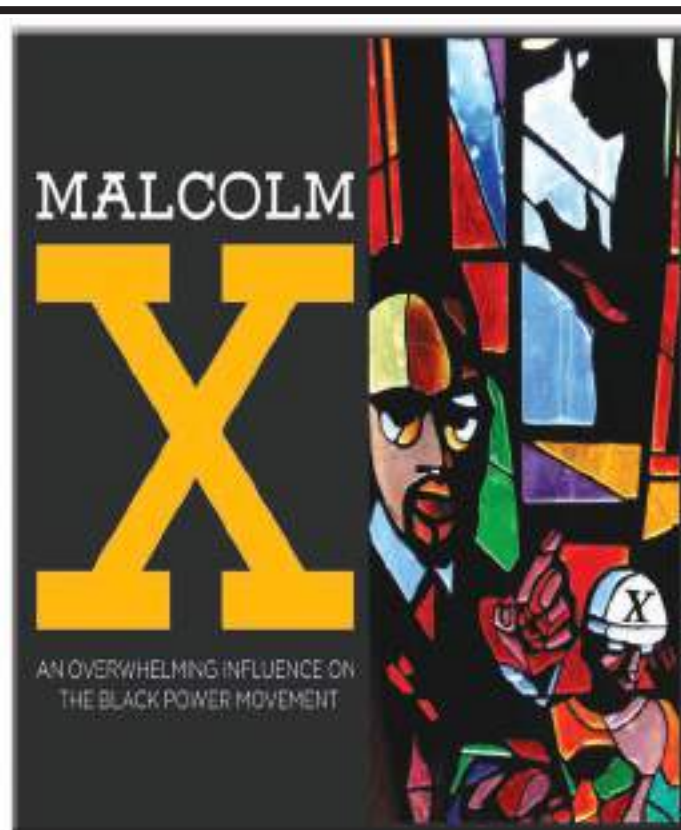
This year's list puts an emphasis on leaders who are navigating the challenge of "unbundling," the notion that disaggregating enterprises of all kinds, from the smallest startups to educational institutions to entire nations, can multiply an organization's effectiveness.

Sorrell was listed as thirty-fourth in the rankings and is one of only two college presidents named in the list, along with Amy Guttman, President of The University of Pennsylvania.

Under Sorrell's leadership, Paul Quinn College has received numerous national awards and achieved milestones including receiving full-accreditation from the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS); receiving the most seven-figure gifts in school history, and restructuring the curriculum to focus on training and skills for job opportunities.

"Sorrell is a rare leader who is passionate in his efforts to disrupt traditional thinking and innovate towards what is possible for America's students in higher education," said Bridget Burns, Executive Director, University Innovation Alliance, who most recently honored Sorrell with the National Award for Leadership in Student Success, Innovation and Collaboration this month.

Others on the Fortune Top 50 leaders list include Bill and Melinda Gates (No. 2), Apple CEO Tim Cook (No. 14), and Oprah Winfrey (No. 27). The "Students of Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School" ranked No. 1.

COMEDIAN BILL COSBY FOUND GUILTY IN ANDREA CONSTAND SEXUAL ASSAULT TRIAL

NORRISTOWN, Pa.—A Montgomery County jury on Thursday found comedian Bill Cosby guilty on all three counts of aggravated indecent assault in the case involving Andrea Constand, a former Temple University employee, who sought career advice and friendship from the entertainer.

The decision came after more than a day of deliberations and after having Cosby's deposition testimony read back to them.

Cosby, 80, faces up to 30 years in prison.

He was released on \$1 million bail pending sentencing.

District Attorney Kevin Steele asked the judge to remand Cosby, citing his "enormous wealth and means."

"He will flee," Steele said.

Judge Steven T. O'Neill argued that he doesn't have a plane and hasn't missed a courtroom.

"He doesn't have a plane, you a—hole," Cosby yelled out. "I'm sick of this."

He did not react to the verdict, even as each of the 12 members of the jury were

polled individually.

Cosby's spokesman Andrew Wyatt said he was disappointed by the verdict. His attorneys said they

plan to appeal, citing numerous improper rulings by O'Neill and a juror who was kept on the panel after he was overheard saying, "he's

guilty, we can all go home," before the trial began.

GAO SET TO ISSUE ADVERTISING SPENDING REPORT

A long-awaited report that details what federal agencies spend on advertising in African American-owned newspapers is finally near completion, according to officials in the General Accounting Office (GAO).

The report comes as the National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA), a trade organization made up of more than 200 Black-owned media companies, that reach more than 20 million people each week, celebrates 191 years of the Black Press.

It also comes ahead of critical midterm election season in which the NNPA announced a historic voter registration drive that has a goal of registering 5 million new, Black voters.

"We now have July as the projected completion and issuance time frame for the report," said Charles Young, the managing director of public affairs for the GAO, which acts as the authoritative audit unit for the federal government.

Democratic D.C. Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton has been at the forefront of a multi-year effort pushing for

a new report. CBC members and others have since joined her call.

"The Black Press allow us to reach people who need to hear the real story and the power of the African American print press is validation and people appreciate the real story," said CBC Chairman Cedric Richmond (D-La.). "When you advertise in the Black Press, you get a sense of credibility."

The federal government serves as the largest advertiser in the country and a 2007 GAO report on advertising spending revealed that just five percent of the \$4.3 billion available for advertising campaigns went to minority-owned businesses.

Five agencies—the Department of Defense, Department of the Treasury, the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of the Interior, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration —were singled out in the 2007 report, the most recent audit available.

"It's important that news outlets and media companies owned or published by individuals of color, with a primary mission to serve communities of color, have

the same opportunities as other media outlets—especially as African Americans and Hispanic Americans continue to grow in number in the

United States," Norton said. "We believe that this request for a new report is particularly timely, because GAO will be conducting an audit of spending by federal agencies on public relations and advertising."

In a historic announcement during NNPA's Black Press Week in Washington, D.C., NNPA President and CEO Dr. Benjamin F. Chavis, Jr., said the organization and several others, including Rainbow Push, National Action Network, the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education, the National Association of Real Estate Brokers, the NAACP, the National Urban League, CBC, and the AME Church had partnered for an unprecedented voter registration drive.

Chavis called the drive a coordinated effort to combat hate and dissent and to spread love and unity.

"Come November, we're going to have the largest Black voter turnout in American history. This is a

payback year," Chavis said. "The most important election of our lifetime will be the 2018 midterm elections."

It's become apparent for those who tabulate votes and for those who analyze elections, that the Black vote can be the defining factor, said NNPA Chair Dorothy R. Leavell.

"The Black vote can determine who wins and who loses and it's important that people don't take the Black vote for granted," Leavell said.

She said it was crucial that the GAO issue a new report so that it's apparent which agencies are giving Black-owned newspapers a fair share in advertising spending.

Young acknowledged that the report has taken quite some time—Norton and a host of U.S. Congress and Senate members formally called for the audit in March 2016.

"Things can sometimes take longer than planned," Young said. "But [July] is the expectation."

Shaquem Griffin finally hears his name at NFL draft



ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — Shaquem Griffin came back. The crowd loved it. Players in attendance not selected in the first two days of the NFL draft usually head out of town before the fourth through seventh rounds.

Griffin, who sat through 100 names being called in the first three rounds, wasn't in AT&T Stadium on Saturday. Then he was after Seattle spent the 141st overall selection on the Central Florida linebacker who has

no left hand. That fifth-round choice, announced in Seattle, drew loud cheers from fans at Jerry's World. Griffin, whose left hand was amputated when he was young, has become the feel-good story this year

and one of the most popular players in this draft because of his perseverance, outgoing personality and, of course, his talent. "I mean that was amazing," Griffin said. "To even have an opportunity to come back, I didn't think I was going to be able to come back and do it ... I don't remember seeing too many people who have left and came back. "That was the most amazing experience of my entire life. Me thinking about it, that moment, to be up on that stage and having the crowd go crazy, it was like we had won the Peach Bowl all over again. It was nuts." Griffin helped UCF go undefeated last season, then blew through the NFL combine with a 4.38 in the 40, sensational lifting work with his prosthetic, and a can-do attitude.

Exactly the sort of player the Seahawks seem to find; they drafted his twin brother, Shaquill, out of UCF last year. "It's been a really good experience," Shaquem said. "I would have been crazy to turn an experience down like this. I'm just glad I was one of the selected few to be here." Griffin had one of the more unusual ways of finding out he was chosen. "I was using the restroom and my brother came and tackled me with my cell-phone, saying 'answer it, answer it,' and I looked, and that's when tears started pouring down," Griffin explained. "I literally went to use the restroom and that's when my brother busted in and tackled me. I think I was more scared of him tackling me in the bathroom and not

knowing what was happening than anything." Griffin received, by far, the biggest cheers of the day — louder even than when the Cowboys' selections were announced. And he made a promise: "Great things are coming to Seattle." Griffin's selection early in the fifth round enlivened a day in which most picks are relatively unknown or obscure players. Not all, though. Michigan defensive tackle Maurice Hurst was taken one spot in front of Griffin by Oakland. The All-American would have gone much earlier, but a heart condition was discovered at the combine, dropping him far down draft boards.

Stephen Curry returns to score 28, Warriors beat Pelicans

OAKLAND, Calif. — Long before tipoff, Stephen Curry swished his routine tunnel shot on the second try. Once the game began, the two-time MVP stood along the bench anxiously waiting for his turn, shaking his legs and clapping his hands with nervous energy and anticipation. Then — mouthpiece dangling, of course — Curry finally entered at the 4:20

mark of the first quarter to a roaring ovation from the Oracle Arena crowd and immediately got to work. He knocked down a 3-pointer from the left wing 11 seconds later and was off and running in Golden State's 121-116 victory over the New Orleans Pelicans on Tuesday night. Curry came off the bench to score 28 points in a triumphant return from a knee injury and nearly six weeks off, and the Warriors held off Anthony Davis and

the pesky Pelicans to go ahead 2-0 in the Western Conference semifinals. Kevin Durant scored 29 points with a huge 3-pointer with 3:10 to play, to go with seven assists and six rebounds in Golden State's franchise-record 14th consecutive postseason victory at Oracle Arena. Green contributed 20 points, 12 assists and nine rebounds while battling Davis on both ends all night.
