THE DALLAS COWBOYS EDGE THE CLEVELAND BROWNS

(AP) - For every play but one, Dallas Cowboys Quarterback Tony Romo protected the ball through a career-high seven sacks and led a rally to put Dallas in position to win on Sunday, November 18, 2012.

Cowboy Dan Bailey kicked a 38-yard field goal in overtime and Dallas overcame a critical fumble by Romo that sparked a wild ending in the Cowboys' 23-20 victory against Cleveland. It was the 12th straight road loss for the Browns.

Dallas won for the first time in six games when Romo was sacked at least five times. Despite the constant pressure, he still finished 35 of 50 for 313 yards with the touchdown to Bryant, who had 12 catches for a career-high 145 yards.







DEAR EDITOR:

The Dallas Independent School District added another \$66 million to its financial reserves during the 2011-12 school year, catapulting the district's fund balance to an all-time high of \$201 million.

The district's annual financial statements were audited by the external auditing firm of Deloitte and Touche LLP and were presented by management during a meeting of the district's board held on November 19.

"The increase in the fund balance for the third consecutive year is a solid indicator of how well the district has been managing its finances, particularly at a time when it has faced two significant reductions in funding from

the state," said Mike Miles, Superintendent of Schools. "As a result of the efforts made to build financial reserves, the district will not have to take out a short-term loan to meet payroll for the first time in several years."

The superscription for Psalm 30 reads - "A Psalm and song at the dedication of the house of David." Many scholars advance that the very site of the future temple is being dedicated (I Chronicles 21:26; 22:1). The psalm of study may be classified as a thanksgiving psalm; that is, Psalm 30 is describing David's earnest thanksgiving to the Lord for showing favor to him through the Lord's deliverance.

Because of some illness that David experienced and was delivered, David found himself praising God. When the Lord has healed you and demonstrated His mercy in your life, then you need to praise Him, for Psalm 116:1-5 says - "I love the LORD, because he hath heard my voice and my supplications. 2 Because he

hath inclined his ear unto me, therefore will I call upon him as long as I live. 3 The sorrows of death compassed me, and the pains of hell (sheol) gat hold upon me: I found trouble and sorrow. 4 Then called I upon the name of the LORD; O LORD, I beseech thee, deliver my soul. 5 Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; yea, our God is merciful."

In verses 1-5, David describes his deliverance from being chastened by the Lord. Being elevated from his troubling experience, David was determined to praise God - "I will extol thee, O LORD; for thou hast lifted me up, and hast not made my foes to rejoice over me" (v. 1). Because of his deliverance, his enemies could not have the occasion to have satisfaction. David's deliverance is further described in that God answered David's prayer and healed him (vs. 2-3). David's illness was at the point of death, but God healed

him. Due to the Lord's mighty deliverance, David summons the people to sing praise to the Lord. After one has experienced God's deliverance, one should have a song of praise to the Lord.

In Psalm 30:5, it is praise-worthy to note that God's anger is temporary, but His favor (kindness) is continual - "For his anger endureth but a moment; in His favour is life: weeping may endure for a night, but joy cometh in the morning." Our God is a good God, worthy to be praised. We may experience God's anger for a moment, but joy comes in the morning.

Boasting in self-confidence, David described his sin of living independently of the Lord. David's declaration in verses 6-7 recounts an event when David arrogantly numbered the people and caused a plague that resulted in 70,000 Israelites to be slain (I Chronicles 21:2, 8, 14). David was

severely taught a lesson that when one moves independently of the Lord, disastrous results will follow. We must seek God's face in every endeavor of life. Because of the devastating plague that resulted from David's pride, we find David crying out to the Lord in verses 8-10 - "I cried to thee, O LORD; and unto the LORD I made supplication" (v. 8).

Sin will cause distress, and distress will cause one to cry out to the Lord. This psalm of thanksgiving concludes in verses 11-12 with David singing praise to the Lord having been delivered from such a plight due to his sin - "Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness; To the end that my glory may sing praise to thee, and not be silent. O LORD my God, I will give thanks unto thee for ever."

Texas A&M in Prime Position for BCS Bowl

AT PRESS TIME (AP)- Fiesta Bowl director Mr. Robert Shelton said this week that a certain upset in Tuscaloosa, Ala., recently caught his attention.

Shelton said he's got his eye on No. 9 Texas A&M, and why not? The Aggies are 8-2 and eighth in the BCS standings, riding a three-game winning streak, coming off the big upset over No. 1 Alabama and led by Heisman Trophy contender Johnny Manziel.

"If you have a signature player and a team that's on the rise, those are two very good signs

we look for," Shelton said. "And A&M has both."

A&M's 29-24 victory over Alabama not only put the Aggies in the national spotlight, but vaulted them into the discussion to be an at-large pick for a BCS bowl. The Aggies haven't been to the BCS since they won the Big 12 in 1998 and lost to Ohio State in the Sugar Bowl.

With two regular season games remaining, A&M is currently bunched up with six SEC teams in the Top 10 of the BCS standings. Alabama, Georgia, Florida, LSU, A&M and South Carolina hold the Nos. 4-9 spots in order, a stretch no conference has ever held, and that logjam makes the bowl projections a bit tough to figure out.






