VOTERS APPROVE \$1.6 BILLION DALLAS ISD BOND PACKAGE

A strong majority of voters have approved Dallas ISD's proposed \$1.6 billion bond package that is anticipated to fund nine new schools, 326 new classrooms, facility enhancements that support academic programs, and facility improvements at almost every district school.

Preliminary results show that approximately 60 percent of voters supported the bond, which is not anticipated to raise school district tax rates. The preliminary results will become final when the board canvases the votes on Nov. 12.

"The passage of this bond allows us to make significant strides in creating learning environments that will help all of our students graduate college and career ready," Superintendent Michael Hinojosa said. "We look forward to working with the Board and our school communities to ensure that the work funded by this bond exceeds all of our expectations."

The bond package will, in part, invest in three district priorities: early childhood education, the Public School Choice initiative, and the Career and Technical Education program.

DALLAS FIRE CHIEF LOUIE BRIGHT TO RETIRE IN MARCH

Dallas Fire Chief Louie Bright III has announced his intention to retire on March 30, 2016. Chief Bright's Dallas Fire Rescue (DFR) career began in September 1981, and he was appointed fire chief in April 2012.

"It has been an honor to serve the citizens of Dallas for the last 34 years, during a time period of significant changes and growth in the fire service," said Chief Bright.

Chief Bright said the decision to retire was an easy one; it is the perfect time to hand over the reins, spend more time with family and pursue the next chapter in his life. His efforts have included creating a culture of customer service, safety and fire prevention throughout the community and among the members of the department, as well as the collaborative relationships that DFR has fostered with other emergency-response organizations throughout Texas, and



across the nation.

"Chief Bright's leadership has led the department through challenging times, and after each challenge we have become a better department," said City Manager A.C. Gonzalez. "He championed the innovative Community Paramedic Program that has become a national model for EMS service providers. Chief Bright has also improved

our ability to keep citizens safe through free smoke detector installation, fire prevention and fire safety education. He has done all of this with a calm leadership style and demeanor that values everyone."

The city manager will begin the process for a national search for a new Dallas Fire-Rescue chief next month.


WNBA's Dallas Wings Introduced in DFW Metroplex

Credo of The Black Press

The Black Press believes that America can best lead the world away from racial and national antagonisms when it accords to every person, regardless of race, color or creed, full human and legal rights. Hating no person, fearing no person, the Black Press strives to help every person in the firm belief that all are hurt as long as anyone is held back.

Now there is more and more evidence that the parents have it right - and the deep-pocket "reformers" are simply wrong. First, the Obama Administration - which has pushed high-stakes testing as central to its education agenda - announced that kids were being tested too often, with too much school time devoted to preparing for and taking required tests. In what a

writer for the New Yorker described as a major "mea culpa," the administration now recommends that standardized testing be limited to 2 percent of class time. Maybe music, art and creativity will have a chance once more.

Second, a report by the Center for Media and Democracy on charter schools - the centerpiece of the so-called reformers' agenda - reports that some \$3.7 billion in federal money has been larded onto charter schools in the past two decades with virtually no accountability.

The result is often a simple rip-off: schools that never open or open for a few months and shut down. Some highly touted cyber charters - schools featuring online courses - are, as Education Week reported, essentially useless, like not going to school at all. Others, like the highly touted New York Success Academy Schools, apparently boost their test scores by identifying low-

performing students who have "got to go" and finding ways to get rid of them.

And now the National Assessment of Education Progress, the gold standard for measuring progress, reports that American kids have lost ground in math, and either were stagnant (4th graders) or worse (8th graders) in reading.

Charters are spreading like kudzu; wall-to-wall standardized testing is nearly universal - and the parents are right: It isn't working.

The reality, as National Education Association President Lily Eskelsen Garcia has pointed out, is that the nations that have outperformed the U.S. in recent years don't do the things that the deep-pocket reformers have been touting. They don't terrorize teachers; they train, respect and pay them. They don't set up private charters and drain money from public education; they devote more resources to the poorest

students, not less. They don't do repeated high-stakes standardized testing; they evaluate teachers and students carefully, mentor them and improve them.

The school "reformers" are hurting, not helping. Closing neighborhood schools too often divorces parents from their students' schools. Demeaning teachers is leading to higher turnover, when experience is central to becoming a good teacher. Repeated standardized testing takes the joy out of learning, making kids less likely to find their strength.

As Jeff Bryant of the Education Opportunity Network writes, parents are driving an "education spring," revolting against an elite reform agenda that is driving away good teachers, undermining public schools, and draining funds and fun from our public schools. Parents are right to keep the pressure on.

"THE PETITION OF A TROUBLED SAINT" PSALM 102:1-28

In this great Messianic psalm, the psalmist is in deep distress and he is earnestly crying out to the Lord to extend relief. Various circumstances of life can overwhelm us, and we do need the assurance from the Lord that relief is on the way! During times of severe affliction, the psalmist found out in Psalm 116:1-5 that the Lord will deliver, for he says, "I love the LORD, because He hath heard my voice and my supplications. Because He hath inclined His ear unto me, therefore will I

call upon Him as long as I live. The sorrows of death compassed me, and the pains of hell gat hold upon me: I found trouble and sorrow. Then called I upon the name of the LORD; O LORD, I beseech thee, deliver my soul. Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; yea, our God is merciful."

Isn't the Lord good and abundantly kind? He has blessed us with many blessings and we need to praise His name! He is good all of the time; He is good when we are healthy; He is good when we are frail and sick; He is good when it is arid outside; He is good when it is cold. He is good all the time, and all the time He is good! In the midst of his trouble, the psalmist implores the Lord to hear and answer his prayer as he cries out in verses 1-2: "Hear my prayer, O LORD, and let my cry come unto thee. Hide not thy face from me in the day when I am in trouble; incline thine ear unto

me: in the day when I call answer me speedily."

In verses 3-7, the psalmist describes his anguishing condition, a condition that warrants God's help. He states in verse 8, "Mine enemies reproach me all the day; and they that are mad against me are sworn against me." The psalmist's physical being was weak and he was mentally experiencing depression. Because of the trouble that he was experiencing, the psalmist felt that his life was coming to a close, "My days are like a shadow that declineth; and I am withered like grass" (vv. 10-11).

However, in verses 12-13, he is assured that the Lord will answer his prayer for he knows - "But thou, O LORD, shall endure for ever; and thy remembrance unto all generations" (v. 13). His confidence in the Lord continues for the psalmist declared that the Lord will not forsake those who love Him; moreover, the psalmist

was confident that the Lord will restore Zion (vv. 14-17).

In verses 18-22, the psalmist anticipates that future generations will praise the Lord as a result of hearing that God delivered His people. God's infinite name will be praised when there is a gathering in Zion. From creation, the psalmist points out "Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth: and the heavens are the work of thy hands" (v. 25). This Messianic psalm anticipates the arrival of the Millennium Kingdom when Jerusalem will be restored and the nations of the world will worship our great God, Jesus Christ as the psalmist concludes: "But thou art the same, and thy years shall have no end. The children of thy servants shall continue, and their seed shall be established before thee" (vv. 27-28).






