# PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA IN DALLAS TO PROMOTE HEALTHCARE



(AP) - President Barack Obama traveled to Dallas Texas to push his health care initiative.

Texas has one of the highest concentrations of uninsured people in the USA - with more than 670,000, or 28% of Dallas County's population, uninsured.

Texas also is among the 36 states not providing their own insurance marketplaces, which means residents there must sign up through the federal website that stumbled badly upon its launch Oct. 1.

Obama's visit will also underscore the obstacles the law faces in Republican states where governors such as Texas' Rick Perry have refused to take advantage of a provision in the law that expands Medicaid to assist more of the working poor. More than 23 percent of Texas residents are uninsured.

President flew to Dallas on Wednesday, to meet and thank volunteers who are helping consumers learn about and enroll in medical coverage plans through health insurance marketplaces.

Obama visited Temple Emanu-El to join canvassers and navigators working with the Dallas Area Interfaith group.

The president later attended two Democratic fundraising events before departing.

Dallas County Judge Clay Jenkins cheered President Barack Obama's Dallas visit as a "big boost to our local efforts" to sign up residents for health insurance.

## State Water Implementation Fund Proposition Approved

These are the Constitutional Amendments Approved on November 5, 2013

**Proposition Number 6**  
Will create a 2 Billion State Water Implementation Fund as a special fund inside the state treasury and outside the General Revenue Fund. Money in the fund would be administered by the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB).

**Proposition Number 1**  
Will authorize the legislature to provide by statute for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a member of the United States armed services who is killed in action, as long as the surviving spouse has not remarried. An eligible spouse who later qualifies a different property as the surviving spouse's residence homestead could be authorized by statute to receive an exemption from ad valorem taxation in the same amount received for the first qualifying homestead during the last year in which the surviving spouse received the exemption.

**Proposition Number 2**  
Repeal the constitutional provision requiring the creation of a State Medical Education Board and a State Medical Education Fund, neither of which is in operation. No new loans have been made from the fund by the board in more than 25 years, and the board currently has no appointees and receives no program funding.

**Proposition Number 3**  
Authorizes local political subdivisions to extend the length of time that aircraft parts could remain temporarily in this state before being subject to ad valorem taxation. Under current law, merchandise, wares, and goods (including aircraft parts) may remain in this state temporarily for up to 175 days before being subject to ad valorem taxation; the proposed amendment would permit taxing entities to extend the exemption up to 730 days after the date that a person acquired or imported aircraft parts in the state.

**Proposition Number 4**  
Would allow the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of part of the market value of the residence homestead of a partially disabled veteran or the surviving spouse of a partially disabled veteran if the residence home-

stead was donated to the disabled veteran at no cost to the veteran by a charitable organization.

**Proposition Number 5**  
"Reverse mortgage" to authorize the making of reverse mortgage loans for the purchase of homestead property in addition to the current legal uses of those loans, and would give lenders recourse against borrowers who fail to timely occupy the homestead properties purchased with such loans. Would also add to the definition of "reverse mortgage" an extension of credit that is not closed before the 12th day after the lender provides to the prospective borrower a written notice summarizing risks and conditions of a reverse mortgage. The language of the required notice is prescribed in the resolution.

**Proposition Number 7**  
Will Allow "home-rule" cities to fill short term vacancies by appointment.

**Proposition Number 8**  
Will Allow Hidalgo County in South Texas to create a hospital district and raise property taxes to support it.

**Proposition Number 9**  
Increases the disciplinary power of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct

## D-Link DARTs around Dallas

D-Link buses (DART Route 722), identified by a vibrant magenta and yellow bus wrap, arrive every 15 minutes from 11 a.m. to 11:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. More than 30 matching signs and ground graphics easily identify key bus stops, with nearly 70 stops total along the route.

"Rail brings people into downtown; D-Link takes them to the doorstep of their destination," says DART President/Executive Director Gary Thomas.

The circulator route links such downtown destinations as the American Airlines Center, Klyde Warren Park, Perot Museum of Nature and Science, The Sixth Floor Museum, Dallas Arts District, Main Street hotels and restaurants, Omni Dallas Hotel and Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center. Oak Cliff points of interest

include the shops and restaurants of the Bishop Arts District and the Kessler and Texas theaters. After 6 p.m., the route extends from Convention Center Station to Cedars Station to serve the entertainment district around Gilley's Dallas and South Side on Lamar.

"This circulator represents another advance in our ongoing efforts to revitalize downtown and provides a much-needed link to southern Dallas," Mayor Mike Rawlings says. "I am excited about the potential of new stops being added in the future as our city continues to grow south."

### Tour Dallas for Free

To encourage ridership, project partners are offering the D-Link service for free, eliminating the need to figure out fares or locate a ticket machine. Passengers still must purchase a DART pass to transfer to other bus and rail services.

### Improving Walkability

While D-Link is undoubtedly a tourist and convention visitor resource, the frequency and route also make it easier to reach employers located in and near downtown, including hospitals, restaurants, hotels, office buildings, cultural attrac-

tions and retail. Employees gain greater options for lunch and after-hours dining; urban residents can get around without driving.

D-Link is designed to complement other current and future transit services, including the DART System, Trinity Railway Express and Amtrak. The Union Station to Oak Cliff Dallas Streetcar and the M-Line Urban Circulator projects both will be complete by 2015, and the D-Link route will adapt accordingly.

The opening of the Orange Line extension to DFW Station in December 2014, combined with

D-Link, will enable travelers to work or play in Dallas without renting a car. Local North Texas residents also will be able to explore more areas of the city without driving.

Rev. Johnny C. Smith, Pastor – Mount Moriah Missionary Baptist Church

The superscription of this penitential psalm reads, "To the chief Musician, a Psalm of David, when Nathan the prophet came unto him, after he had gone in to Bathsheba." The superscription relates to the occasion when David committed his gross sin of adultery with Bathsheba, Uriah's wife (II Samuel 11). The psalmist, David, begins this psalm in his petition to God, appealing to God on the foundation of God's loyal love and compassion for people - "Have mercy upon me, O God, according to thy lovingkindness:

### "A SAINT WHO RECEIVED GOD'S CLEMENCY AND FULL FORGIVENESS" PSALM 51:1-19

according unto the multitude of thy tender mercies blot out my transgressions (v. 1).

It is a tremendous comfort to know that believers who have sinned may appeal to God, asking for forgiveness and be fully restored to proper fellowship with God. When we sin as believers, we need to confess our sin, for I John 1:9 states, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." In verse 2, David is earnestly asking the Lord to thoroughly cleanse him of his sin. In sinning against God in his sin with Bathsheba, David was guilty of breaking two of the Ten Commandments: murder, the sixth commandments; and adultery, the seventh commandment.

In verses 3-4, we find David earnestly and sincerely confessing his sin, "For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me" (v. 3); however, he does so only

about a year later when the prophet Nathan confronted him about this issue (II Samuel 12:13-18). In a state of acknowledging his guilt, David remarks that he was born with a sin nature and that God desires rightful living (vv. 5-6).

Pleading with the Lord to thoroughly cleanse him, "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean: wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow" (v. 7). David also appeals to God, asking for inward renewal (vv. 10-12). David is requesting God for spiritual renewal because he wanted to experience the joy of his salvation - "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me" (v. 10). When David sinned, he did not lose his salvation; however, he lost the joy of his salvation. Likewise, believers in fellowship with the Lord will experience the joy of being saved. As believers, we can never lose our salvation because

salvation is a gift from God, and God does not withdraw His salvation when we sin. Salvation is given to the one who accepts God's gift, Jesus Christ by faith (St. John 3:16, 36; 5:24; 6:37; 10:28-29; 14:6).

On the basis of God's forgiveness, David vows that he would testify fully in his service to God (vv. 13-17). If forgiven, David vows that he would teach sinners the ways of God (v. 13). Also, David declares that he would sing and praise God (vv. 14-15). Lastly, David declares that he would sacrifice to God (vv. 16-17). This psalm closes with a petition that the Lord would fortify the city of Jerusalem in view of the vile sin of its leader, David (vv. 18-19).

## Are You Raising One of the Next Generation of Hoodlums: Raising a Boy to be a Man

With so many single mothers raising their sons alone, the question has been posed, "Is it possible for a woman to raise a boy to be a man?" My response to this question: that depends on what you mean by a man. If by man you mean an adult of the male species, then of course a female can do that because she can do nothing but house, feed and clothe him, and her boy will eventually become an adult, and he is already of the male species. If, however, by man you mean a gentleman who is a well prepared member of his generation for the role of future husband, father, and honorable member of society, then I ask you to

consider the following.

Who would be a better teacher of our boys than our own men? How can a female tell her son what it is like to be a black man in this society or how to face life as a black man in society? How can a female relate to what he may be feeling? As a woman, I can only sympathize with him. His father can relate. His father has been there, done that! If his dad is not there, his mother needs other "successful" black men as mentors for him. But, as more of our black men in the community get railroaded by society at large, where else do we turn?

Many of us are aware there have been many cases in our communities where the women raised boys who grew up to be pretty decent men, but that was because she was forced to do so. And that job is not easy. Most will acknowledge that a boy needs his father. No woman should have to bear the responsibility of raising a child all by herself nor should she be the one to teach a boy how to be a man. This should be the responsibility of the father. It takes a man and a woman to

properly raise a child. This is a major problem with us as a people today. There is no balance, a child (boy or girl) need both. A child (boy or girl) needs both masculine and feminine love for ultimate development. If nurturing only comes from one side, then that is an imbalance which is the current state we are in as a people.

Much of the problems with young African males are due to the absence of a father in the household. We really need to get over the line of thinking that it's okay for a woman to raise children all by herself, because it is not!

Farrakhan once said, "Without family, we don't have a strong community." Without a strong community, our children will continue to be lacking. With strong community, our boys (and girls) have many watchful eyes and helping hands, and this is needed today more than ever. Many of us can remember when as children all of the adults in our community helped to teach us and to keep us on the straight and narrow.

I believe that boys who don't have fathers must look and be guided toward other

reliable men for guidance. Maybe not by going up and asking, "How can I be a man?" But by observing the things that these men do and don't do, and then noting the outcomes of these actions. There are many things a mother can teach a boy, but a mother can NEVER teach the lessons a boy needs to learn about how to be a man.

Mothers: if you are in the process of raising your son without benefit of his dad, make a serious effort to have male role models in his life. Teach him the significance of being responsible. Assign him regular chores. Refuse to talk negatively to him about his absent father and keep him involved in church and Sunday School. Enroll him in Boy Scouts or similar organizations so that responsible male role models are an integral and regular part of his life.






