# WOMEN AGAINST TRUMP!

With increasing numbers of women coming forward with independent stories of sexual assault by Donald Trump against them, it appears that the New York real estate will perform poorly with that the nation's largest segment of voters, women, on Election Day.

Political forecasters predict that the 2016 presidential election will have the largest gender gap in the nation's political history, with large numbers of women that would normally vote for the Republican presidential nominee either casting a protest ballot or simply staying home because they are offended by the character and remarks of their party's candidate.

One of the nation's most popular women, First Lady Michelle Obama, recently castigated Trump during an election speech in New Hampshire, saying that his lewd comments about women were insulting and that all Americans should reject his personal and political rhetoric.

"It hurts," she said speaking about Trump's comments. "It is like that sick, sinking feeling you get when you're walking down the street, minding your own business, and some guy yells out vulgar words about your body."

First Lady Obama, the mother of two young daughters, did not mention Trump by name but her audience of young and middle-aged women knew exactly who she was speaking about. The language used by Trump has been painful for so many of us, not just as women, but as parents trying to protect our children and raise them to be

caring, respectful adults, she said.

"We have a candidate for the presidency who over the course of his lifetime has said things about women that are so shocking, so demeaning and I will simply not repeat any of them here today. And last week we saw this candidate actually brag about sexually assaulting women. It has shaken me to my core in a way that I could not have predicted."

The First Lady concluded her remarks by telling the story of a 6-year-old boy who said to his mother, "I think Hillary Clinton will be president because the other guy called someone a piggy, and you cannot be president if you call someone piggy."

Even among evangelical voters there is a split regarding the morality of voting for someone who has exhibited the "tastelessness" of Trump. "The idea of a monolithic

evangelical voting constituency is no longer applicable," said Samuel Rodriguez, Jr., who heads the National Hispanic Christian Leadership Conference. Mr. Rodriguez, whose organization represents about 40,000 faith institutions, refused to lend his support to the Trump candidacy.

Jen Hatmaker, a nationally known evangelical speaker from Austin who speaks to thousands of Christian women across the country recently called the Republican presidential nominee a "national disgrace" and suggested to her followers that they consider other people for president when they vote in November.

"Trump has consistently normalized violence, sexual deviance, bigotry and hate speech, she said. "I would not accept this from my seventh-grade son, much less from a potential leader of the free world."

## Principal for a Day strengthens Dallas ISD partnerships with business, civic leaders

Principal for a Day on Oct. 11 provided more than 200 business and community leaders with a behind-the-scenes look at Dallas ISD schools.

Dallas Regional Chamber and Capital One help sponsor the annual event that sees the volunteers leading schools across the district. The Principals for a Day have the opportunity to shadow local principals, meet with students, read to classes, attend student performances, and participate in a number of other activities that make up a typical school day.

Superintendent Michael Hinojosa has called PFAD one of the best things the district does every year.

Before touring the school, Bryan Adams High School Leadership Academy Principal Richard Kastl briefed PFAD participant George Tang, chief operating officer of CFT Educate Texas, on the great things happening at the campus.

"This is a great opportunity to learn about the school, learn about the

## "A SURVEY OF THE BOOK OF ROMANS"

### ROMANS 12:9-21

#### Some Exhortations to Believers Dealing with Relationships

After the grand Apostle Paul had admonished these believers to dedicate their bodies and minds to God (vs. 1-2), he now gives some short exhortations dealing with relationships (vs. 9-16). First of all, Paul urged that "love be without dissimulation (hypocrisy)" (v. 9). As believers, our love should be without pretense or deceit. If we genuinely love others, it will manifest itself in good works. The opposite of love is to hate and there is a place for hatred. We are exhorted in verse 9 to "abhor that which is evil. We are to hate all forms of evil. By contrast, we are to "cleave to that which is good."

Continuing with his previous admonition to love, Paul said - "Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love" (v. 10). Not only should we have love for mankind in general, but we are to express special family

love toward other believers. In addition to expressing love toward other believers, Paul went on to say that - "In honour preferring one another." In other words, we need to place others' interest before our own. In verse 11, Paul exhorts all believers to be zealous in our Christian duties; moreover, there is no place for half-heartedness in God's work. We should not be lazy and lag behind in our zeal for God's work!

As we zealously serve in God's work, we should not lose sight of the hope that makes service worthwhile (v. 12). As we serve, stay focused on the Lord's return, for it will enable you to be "patient in tribulation." And a devoted prayer life will also help one to remain steadfast and loyal to God as one undergoes the pressures of life (v. 12). Paul also exhorted these believers to extend their hospitality to

others, which included helping the poor and entertaining visitors who were moving from place to place (v. 13). In verses 9-13, Paul had talked about actions we (Christians) should demonstrate toward others; but, now he discusses how we are to react toward the actions on the part of others (vs. 14-16). Persecution can easily bring out the worst in us; however, Paul admonishes us to bless and not curse the persecutors (v. 14). By doing so, we are expressing Christ's love for them! We are also urged strongly to empathize with people in all circumstances, for verse 15 says - "Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep." In our relationships with others, we need to avoid having a haughty mind, for it will never bring about harmonious relations nor achieve unity of purpose (v. 16). In exhibiting honest and hon-

orable behavior, Christians can eliminate any excuses persecutors may have; thus, as the believers conduct themselves in an honorable way, they will be contributing to peace (vs. 17-18).

Finally, instead of a believer trying to take revenge after they had been mistreated, Paul admonished us to trust in God's promise to execute vengeance. By trusting in God's promise, we will continue to extend deeds of kindness, even when we have been wronged. By helping an enemy and not cursing him, we may cause an enemy to be remorseful and stir him to repentance (vs. 19-20). Paul summarizes this beautiful section of exhortations by saying - "Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good" (v. 21).

## My Day: Legal Genius Series

Jack Greenberg, a Jewish lawyer who led up the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund Inc., for 23 years, died this week. He was 91. The New York Times lauded him as 'one of the most powerful white figures in a movement'. I am sure this name sounds familiar to you, especially if you were around doing the civil rights era in the 60's or have read everything you could on the movement, including the struggle for voting rights.

Over the years in this column I have written other articles with this same title. The first legal genius article was about E. Brice Cunningham, a living legend, who was a partner in one of America's most prestigious law firms, Finch, Lockridge and Cunningham; and the second article, Judge L. A. Bedford, Dallas' first black judge (Requiem for a Jurist 1926-2014). These frontier

genius' are so very important to our history and they should not be forgotten or casually tossed aside. I was Brice Cunningham's legal assistant for three years, modeling part time, and remained a part of the legal world after moving to corporate America. Young attorneys like Sam Hudson, Royce West, Craig Washington, Marcus Ranger and others, came to the firm looking for jobs and advice. These were all black attorneys. The noted attorneys of that day were Joe Lockridge, D. B. Mason, L. Clifford Davis, Fort Worth, Fred Finch, and W. J. Durham. The work was long, abundant, audacious and demanding. W. J. Durham and Thurgood Marshall were classmates, which gets me back to Jack Greenberg and the Texas connection.

The nucleus of the black legal network in the 60's was Thurgood Marshall. He collaborated with and delegated the civil rights workload

across the country. This generation clearly had a plan with vision, opportunity driven and they worked it. For example, one evening while working late in the office, the phone rang. It was Thurgood Marshall, calling from New York, looking for Brice. The instructions were simple. "Go down to Nacogdoches, Texas, and get so-and-so out of jail."

Jack Greenberg is deemed the last survivor of a renown legendary Civil Rights Legal Team. He is the last surviving member of the original legal team assembled by Thurgood Marshall, the founding director-counsel of the legal defense fund and later the first African American Supreme Court Justice. This team of seven broke down barriers and set examples in the matter of law that are still researched in law libraries around the globe, with voting rights at the very top. These battles they fought. . . and won. . . leaving a legacy of legal bat-

tles for people all over the world. Did I mention voting rights?

In all, Jack Greenberg was before the Supreme Court in more than 40 civil rights cases. Many prominent attorneys have been a part of the Legal Defense Fund, including Barack Obama, who in one case was co-op attorney on his path to the presidency.

When Thurgood Marshall joined the federal bench, he named Jack Greenberg to succeed him as director of the defense fund now up to 25 attorneys. Jack Greenberg found time to write a book about his odyssey entitled "Crusaders in the Courts: How a Dedicated Band of Lawyers Fought for the Civil Rights Revolution".

Is there a second generation at bat?

## Cowboys vs. Packers

(AP) - Rookie Dak Prescott threw for 247 yards and three touchdowns, and the Dallas Cowboys forced four turnovers in a 30-16 win over the Green Bay Packers and their dysfunctional offense on Sunday.

Prescott was 18 of 27, shaking off two fumbles and an interception, to lead the Cowboys (5-1) to their fifth straight win.

He showed poise in the fourth quarter while marching the Cowboys on a seven-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Cole Beasley for an 18-point lead with 10:26 left.

The score left Packers fans stunned at Lambeau Field. They were booing at times following another choppy game for the offense. The four turnovers were a season high for Green Bay (3-2).

Even two-time NFL MVP quarterback Aaron Rodgers wasn't immune from the jeering. Rodgers finished 31 of 42 for a season-high 294 yards.

But the Packers didn't get into the end zone until Rodgers and Cobb connected on a 6-yard touchdown pass with 6:53 left to get within 27-16.

Rodgers accounted for two turnovers with an interception to go with a fumble on first-and-goal at the Cowboys 1 with 1:10 left in the third quarter. The Packers were lined up in an empty backfield at the time.

The Packers had five fumbles on the day, losing three.

It was Green Bay's worst defeat at home with Rodgers as the starting quarterback since a 37-20 loss to the Giants in the 2011 NFC divisional playoffs.

## DAUGHTER OF OLYMPIC SPRINTER TYSON GAY FATALY SHOT

(AP) - The 15-year-old daughter of Olympic sprinter Tyson Gay was fatally shot in the neck, authorities and the athlete's agent said Sunday, and police have arrested a man in connection with the shooting.

Trinity Gay died at the University of Kentucky Medical Center, the coroner's office for Fayette County said in a statement. The athlete's agent, Mark Wetmore, confirmed in a text message to The Associated Press that Gay's daughter had died.

Police on Sunday evening announced that Dvonta Middlebrooks, 21, was arrested and charged with wanton endangerment and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. A statement said investigators determined that Middlebrooks was in the parking lot and fired multiple shots at the time of the incident.

Another man questioned by police has not been charged.

Lexington police said in a statement that officers went to the parking lot of a restaurant near the University of Kentucky campus in Lexington about 4 a.m. Sunday after witnesses reported an exchange of gunfire between two vehicles. Officers located one of the vehicles and stopped two people for questioning, the statement added.

Police spokeswoman

Brenna Angel said police don't believe Trinity Gay was in either of the vehicles involved.

Trinity Gay competed in the last three Summer Olympics. He was part of a team that won a silver medal in the 4x100-meter relay at the 2012 London Games though that medal was ultimately stripped after Gay tested positive for steroids in 2013.

Last summer's Games in Rio featured another stinging disappointment for Gay, 33, who has battled injuries. He was a member of the American men's 4x100-meter relay team that finished third in the final before being disqualified for an illegal baton exchange between Mike Rodgers and Justin Gatlin. The team's appeal was denied, giving Canada the bronze medal.

Trinity Gay was a sprinter at Lafayette High in Lexington and finished fourth in the 100 meters and fifth in the 200 meters at the state Class 3A high school track meet in May, records show. She also ran on a 4x200 relay team that finished fourth. Her father, who ran years earlier at Lafayette, still holds the state record in the 100 set in 2001.

Fayette County Public Schools Superintendent Manny Caulk said in a statement that "Our hearts are broken this morning over the loss of Trinity to this tragic and senseless act of violence.

Please join us in keeping the Gay family close in thought and prayer and supporting the students, staff, and families at Lafayette High during this unspeakably difficult time."

Grief counselors will be at Lafayette High School on Monday for students and staff, Fayette school spokeswoman Lisa Deffendall added in an email.

The police statement didn't identify Trinity Gay by name, saying a juvenile who was struck at the scene was taken by private vehicle to the UK Hospital and later pronounced dead. Police were still searching for the second vehicle, police said, adding they are continuing to investigate.

A tweet from Kentucky High School Athletic Association Commissioner Julian Tackett tweeted that he was stunned: "Shocked to hear of death of Trinity Gay. A life of such potential cut so tragically short. Sympathies to Tyson and entire family."

USA Track and Field also tweeted, "Sending our thoughts & prayers to @TysonLGay & his loved ones as they mourn the tragic & senseless loss of his daughter, Trinity."

And NBA veteran Vince Carter of the Memphis Grizzlies tweeted his sympathy as well: "Many prayers up to @TysonLGay and his family".

# PRESIDENT OBAMA TALKS ABOUT THE FUTURE OF HBCUS, MY BROTHER'S KEEPER AT NORTH CAROLINA A&T

During a recent town hall discussion at North Carolina A & T University in Greensboro, President Barack Obama said that historically Black colleges that are producing engineers, doctors and dentists serve as the foundation stone for building Black middle class wealth and success, and are also important to the entire nation.

President Obama answered audience questions about the future of historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs), his signature My Brother's Keeper initiative and social activism at the event hosted by "The Undeclared," an ESPN website dedicated to the exploration of sports, race and culture.

As the nation grows more diverse and educational opportunities that were once off-limits to Blacks are now more available, some have questioned the relevancy of HBCUs.

In 2011, the Obama Administration received sharp criticism after changes in the Federal Direct PLUS loan program, disproportionately affected Black students attending HBCUs, forcing many to either delay their dreams of earning a college degree or abandon them altogether. Three years later, the Department of Education issued updated guidelines that were praised by higher education advocates and included less restrictive credit requirements for the loan program.

Obama said that the challenge with the Parent PLUS program was that some of the loans offered were "particularly expensive" and left too many students deeply in debt without graduating.

"The notion was to try to improve the way in which young people were financing their educations," said Obama. "Part of the challenge here is to make sure, not just that [students] enroll in college, but that [they] graduate from college."

Obama said that HBCUs receive \$4 billion a year from the federal government and noted that Pell grant funding to HBCUs increased by 150 percent, while he's been in office.

The president also expressed concerns over state-level budget cuts to higher education that have had a significant impact on the financial stability of HBCUs.

"Unless state legislatures pick up some of this slack, there's only so much the federal government is going to be able to do to fill the void through loans, because ultimately loans mean debt and it adds up and people can get into trouble," said Obama. "If you're really concerned about more resources for HBCUs then

you better vote. If you don't vote, you won't have any say in the decisions that are made in state capitals or in Congress about the support that you receive."

Obama also talked about the future of the My Brother's Keeper initiative (MBK), a program that was launched to address the unique challenges facing young men and boys of color.

Obama said that the central principle of (MBK) is to have some adult who is taking interest in the young men, "to have somebody that is showing them here's an alternative here's a pathway here's an opportunity that you can seize and you are worth something and you are important and you are a leader."

Obama added: "It doesn't take a lot to transform the lives of young men."

MBK has partnered with organizations like the National Basketball Association and major corporations like Sprint have committed to make sure that one million young people have broadband Internet access to start closing that digital gap. Obama said that 250 communities and cities have launched local MBK programs.

"Some cities are doing better than others, some corporate citizens are investing more than others and we want everybody to get involved," said Obama.

When asked about what it takes to manage the challenges of raising a family and a successful career, Obama admitted that balancing professional achievement and family is something that he and the First Lady of the United States Michelle Obama have had to wrestle with.

Managing those responsibilities is particularly burdensome on

the mom, said Obama.

"There's no doubt that Michelle carried a greater burden than I did, particularly, because the nature of my work required a lot of travel," said Obama, adding that soon-to-be dads must understand the level of commitment required to balance work and family responsibilities successfully.

He said that it was important to understand, that if you're going to have a real partnership, you have to give and not just take and you have to be there and present at home.

"On my deathbed I will not remember any bills I passed, I will not remember any speeches I gave, I will not remember getting the Nobel Prize," said Obama. "What I will remember is holding hands with my daughters and taking them down to a park. That's one thing I know, that on my deathbed, that is what I will remember and if you approach life with that attitude then you're going to appropriately invest in what is most important."
