# President Obama Assures Ebola Virus Outbreak In the U.S. Is "Extremely Low"

AP- President Obama announced, after meeting with top health and security officials about the Ebola outbreak in Africa, that the U.S. government is preparing additional measures to screen passengers in the U.S. and overseas as part of the expanding effort to contain the virus.

"We're ... going to be working on protocols to do additional passenger screening both at the source and here in the United States," the president said.

Dr. Tom Frieden, of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, also confirmed that extra screening might include asking travelers who they had contact with and checking to see if they have a fever.

After his meeting, Obama tried to assure Americans that the chance of an outbreak in the U.S. is "extremely low." He said procedures are in place to "rapidly evaluate" those with symptoms.

He also scolded other countries for not doing enough. "We have not seen other countries step up as aggressively as they need to," he said. "I said at the United Nations and I will repeat that this is an area where everybody has to chip in and everybody has to move quickly in order for us to get this under control."

Amid widespread public concern, the Obama administration has said that it won't shut down flights from affected countries, particularly those in West Africa, arguing this would be counterproductive by restricting aid flights.

The Ebola outbreak is believed to have killed more than 3,400 people in West Africa and has taken the biggest toll in Liberia. There aren't enough beds in isolation units to keep up with the hundreds who get sick each week.

The U.S. military is beginning work in the Liberian capital Monrovia on the main structure of the 25-bed clinic that will treat health care workers infected with Ebola. The U.S. has also promised to build 17 other Ebola treatment centers, which would have space for 100 patients each.

This is also a celebration of children, their creativity, their brilliance, love, and unity inclusive of marching bands, entertainment, and participation of area schools. ### A COMMUNITY STATEMENT CONCERNING THE TURMOIL AT DR. BILLY EARL DADE MIDDLE SCHOOL

The Dr. Billy Earl Dade Middle School opened in 2006 with much optimism and enthusiasm for a school of excellence to serve the middle school students in sunny South Dallas. The former elementary school transitioned well to a middle school feeding into Madison High School, giving the two high schools in south Dallas pure feeder patterns. The excitement continued as the principal was one who was well known to the community and many of the students, teachers and ancillary staff were committed to making this an oasis in sunny South Dallas.

For two years, the principal and staff worked toward improving the academic progress of students while at the same time fostering basic social skills development of students, giving students a sense of their personal worth, and engaging the community and community partners in what was slowly but surely could become a beacon of hope and sunshine in sunny South Dallas. The Bond Program provided for a new school, and the Dedication of the new school took place November 2012 under the administration of the principal and staff who had transitioned the school from elementary to middle school. However, the optimism that had carried forth from 2006 through the dedication of the new building in November 2012 was cut short when the principal and teachers were summarily replaced before the move to the new building in the fall of 2013. This transitional staff was replaced with a principal who had no experience as a secondary principal and no experience in sunny South Dallas.



## ARQUILLA SMITH: A DEDICATED WOMAN OF FAITH

Arquilla Smith passed away on Tuesday, Oct. 7, 2014 at her home in Dallas. She was 96.

Mrs. Smith was born on Feb. 1, 1918, to Joe and Elizabeth Holt in Maysfield, TX. (Milam County). She was the youngest of 16 children.

Always ready to worship in church, Mrs. Smith professed her belief in Christ at an early age. She would teach Sunday school to the other children. When she became an adult she moved to Cuero, TX. She received her nursing license and became the owner of a nursing home with her late husband, the Rev. Charles Smith.

Mrs. Smith moved to Dallas in 1968. She was inducted into the Order of the Eastern Star, a lodge affiliated with the International Masons. It is one of the largest fraternal organizations and has both women and men.

An active community organizer, Mrs. Smith was a member of the Association of Community Organization for Reform Now (ACORN). During every election



Mrs. Smith rallied her neighbors and friends to vote. She was a member of the board of directors of KNON 89.3 FM Radio, encouraging the staff to present music requested by the listeners and public service programming.

Never wanting to stop learning, in 1974 Mrs. Smith attended Eastfield Junior College, Mesquite, TX. She may have been the school's first student who was in her late '70s. Mrs. Smith graduated in 1974 with an associate degree in child development.

Up until her 90's Mrs. Smith was very active in the church. In Dallas she was a member of Camp Wisdom United Methodist Church, Munger Place United Methodist Church, Glen

Oaks United Methodist Church, and finally Light of Love Covenant Community Church.

At Camp Wisdom UMC, Mrs. Smith was best known for encouraging the laity to assert themselves as Disciples of Christ. She trained dozens of men, women and youth to become certified "lay speakers", preaching the word of God. In fact, some went on to accept "their call to Christ" and became clergy. She also wrote a Christian play called, "The Great White Throne". It was performed by Camp Wisdom members at churches throughout the Dallas Metroplex.

Mrs. Smith passed away on Oct. 7, 2014. A memorial service was held on Sat., Oct. 11, 2014 at Evergreen Memorial Funeral Home. She leaves to cherish her memory nieces Lola Hayden, Brenda Howard, and Eula Holt; granddaughter Charlene Smith; great grandson Eric Smith; great-great grandson Justin Smith and a host of nieces, nephews, church members and friends.



Unlike any other time in American history, it is important for all eligible citizens to exercise their right to vote on November 4th. Recently, there has been significant dialogue regarding which party will control the House and the Senate in Washington. These conversations highlight a very real point: this election is critical to the future of minorities, and middle-class Americans. Voter engagement is crucial.

In minority communities, there is a common misconception that voter turnout is only important during presidential elections. Consequently, adher-

We say we have "voting power," but we have settled merely for the "power to vote." We fight for the "right to vote" but we fail to "vote right." Voting is a means to gain political power, not an end that simply allows one to participate in the act. As true as those statements are and as many times as we have heard the phrase, "This is the most important election of our time," and as much as we can see our lack of political reciprocity for our precious votes, we continue to fall for the same old tired political trap prior to every election.

Today, Black people vote overwhelmingly for Democrats, as opposed to pre-1933, when the vast majority of Blacks voted for Republicans. Talk about a schizophrenic voting bloc, that be us, y'all. And what do we get in return? A good feeling, that is, until the next election rolls around and the usual

Lost in the frenzy to erect barriers to voting, including reducing the hours available for early voting and imposing strict voter ID requirements, is the embarrassing fact that the United States lags behind more than 100 countries in the percentage of registered voters who show up on Election Day.

The U.S. ranks 120th with a voter turnout rate of 66.5 percent. That's well behind No. 1 Australia (94.5 percent) and even behind Guyana (88.5 percent), Belize (80.4 percent), Mozambique (78 percent), Honduras (72.8 percent) and

ing to this school of thought could result in more than a decade of financial and political oppression. It is not enough to see massive voter turnout in 2016, the same level of voter turnout must occur on November 4th.

Since the election of President Barack Obama, America's first African-American president, the Republican Party has become the "Obstructionist" Party. During the current Congress, the GOP has done everything in its power to ensure the ineffective operation of our federal government. For example, in 2013 the Republican Party caused a government shutdown.

Now, with the help of the U.S. Supreme Court, the Obstructionist Party has shifted its efforts to implementing new voter ID laws and unconstitutional "poll taxes" that block the votes of approximately 600,000 eligible voters in Texas.

The new Texas voter ID law lists state drivers licenses, voter identification certificates, state ID cards, concealed gun permits, military ID's, citizenship certificates, and passports as the only forms of permissible voter identification. Student ID cards, issued by the state's colleges and universities, and other forms of government identification, including a voter registration card, are not acceptable forms of ID under the law.

The ability to utilize concealed gun licenses, as a form of acceptable voter identification highlights the reality that these new laws were created to favor a specific demographic, while disenfranchising others. Why would a state deliberately violate the civil rights of millions of its residents? Research shows that if African-Americans and Latinos successfully turned out to vote, many so-called red states would become blue.

A Congress controlled by

Democrats would guarantee a minimum wage of \$10.10 an hour. This would occur during the first 100 days of a new Congress. Additionally, increased access to early childhood education would become a reality, and the Equal Pay Act, which ensures that women earn the same wages as their male counterparts, would go into effect. But none of these vital changes will occur without proper voter education, and participation.

the occasion for the writing of Psalm 81. Whichever festive day in view, the psalm is filled with excitement over God's great deliverance. In fact, in verses 1-2, the psalmist summons the congregation to sing triumphantly to the Lord, their strength and to accompany their praise with musical instruments - "Sing aloud unto God our strength: make a joyful noise unto the God of Jacob. Take a psalm, and bring hither the timbrel, the pleasant harp with the psaltery."

As a nation (vv. 3-5), they were summoned to keep the statue of appearing at the festival. The very law of God required that every male had to keep the following festivals three times a year: Feast of Passover, Feast of Unleavened Bread, and the Feast

of Tabernacles (Deuteronomy 16:16). As stated in verse 5, "For this was a statute for Israel, and a law of the God of Jacob." In verses 6-7, the psalmist reminded Israel of God's dealings with them during their bondage experience in Egypt and their wilderness experience after they left Egypt. He continued to rehearse God's dealing with the people during the giving of the law.

God had promised to bless the people if they were obedient; therefore, they should not serve another god. God's decree was specific - "Hear, O my people, and I will testify unto thee: O Israel, if thou wilt hearken unto me; There shall no strange god be in thee; neither shalt thou worship any strange god. I am the LORD thy God, which brought thee out

of the land of Egypt: open thy mouth wide, and I will fill it" (vv.8-10).

The psalmist concludes this psalm by recalling that if the nation disobeys, they will be punished (vv. 11-12); as the people did not hearken to the voice of God so verse 12 states, "So I gave them up unto their own hearts' lust: and they walked in their own counsels." On the other hand in verses 13-16, if they obey God, He will bless the nation by destroying their enemies and continually provide for them - "He should have fed them also with the finest of the wheat: and with honey out of the rock should I have satisfied thee" (v.13).

## Voting for the Party or the Person?

suspects return to tell us how important "this" election is and how we should vote their "straight ticket" once again. They want us to believe that all Dems are good and all Repubs are evil. That's insulting to Black voters.

All the Black electorate does is provide jobs for politicians, some of whom care nothing about us and haven't done a day's work in office since we put them there. To make our political situation even worse, many Black voters simply, and I do mean "simply," vote for anyone who claims to be a Democrat. They vote for the party rather than for the person. Quite frankly, and I say this in love, that's just stupid.

Why do we keep falling for this hype? We achieved what most Black people considered the ultimate level of political victory when Barack Obama was elected, yet, since 2008 Black folks have made little or no progress; we still languish at the bottom in the most important category: Economics. Locally, we have elected and supported Democrats who have run our cities into the ground and left their constituents, Black folks, frustrated and marginalized. Yet, we continue to subscribe to the "Vote Democrat!" mantra.

The way we participate in politics is shameful and childish. All we

want is the right to vote, which we couch in terms of "voting power." If it were power we'd be getting something in return for our vote. Regardless of how much we are taken for granted, we keep coming back, subjecting ourselves to it like a bunch of masochists.

Some Black folks say they do not vote for the party, rather they vote for the person. That's easy to say, but in the voting booth it's obviously a different story. I wonder if Barack Obama would have won if he had been a Republican.

As I said, the Black electorate, after all of these years in the political game, is still naive and amateurish. We are still playing just to play and not to win. We remain in the clutches of talking-head commentators who carry the water for the party and instruct us to vote the way they tell us. And we do it!

Before any of you dyed-in-the-wool Democrats get angry because I downed your party, understand that I have the same thing to say about the Republican Party. I believe we must be independent, not necessarily as a structured political party. We should be independent in our thinking and reasoning. That's what the game is really all about. If we are not getting anything from the game, why are we playing?

Carter G. Woodson, in his timeless work, *The Mis-education of the Negro*, declared, "Real politics...is deeply rooted in the economic foundation of the social order." He went on to say, "History does not show that any race, especially a minority group, has ever solved an important problem by relying altogether on one thing, certainly not by parking its political strength on one side of the fence because of empty promises. There are Negroes who know better, but such thinkers are kept in the background by the traducers of the race to prevent the enlightenment of the masses. The misleading politicians are the only persons through whom the traducers act with respect to the Negro, and there are always a sufficient number of mentally undeveloped voters who will supply them a large following."

The right to vote is important, but we reduce and insult the franchise by wearing political party blinders. Stop listening to and following the political hacks' instructions regarding party-line voting. Vote for the person based on his or her record of having worked in your best interest; do not vote for one nebulous political party that cannot be held accountable for ignoring us or taking us for granted.

## U.S. Trails More than 100 Countries in Voter Turnout

Uganda (70.8 percent).

Not surprisingly, countries with compulsory voting, such as Australia, have the highest turnout rates. However, those with such laws and lax enforcement, such as Brazil and Mexico, do not fare as well as Australia. And those that have eliminated compulsory voting, including the Netherlands, reported a subsequent drop in voter participation.

The Center for Voting and Democracy says the easier it is to register, the higher the participation rate.

"Another country with a highly efficient registration process is France. At the age of eighteen, all youth are automatically registered. Only new residents and citizens who have moved are responsible for bearing the costs and inconvenience of updating their registration. Similarly, in Nordic countries, all citizens and residents are included in the official population register, which is simultaneously a tax list,

voter registration, and membership in the universal health system. Residents are required by law to report any change of address to register within a short time after moving. This is also the system in Germany (but without the membership in the health system)."

According to the Center for Voting and Democracy, "The elimination of registration as a separate bureaucratic step can result in higher voter turnout. This is reflected in statistics from the United States Bureau of Census, 1982-1983. States that have same day registration, or no registration requirements, have a higher voter turnout than the national average. At the time of that report, the four states that allowed election day registration were Minnesota, Wisconsin, Maine, and Oregon." Since then, Idaho has changed to allow same day registration. North Dakota is the only state that requires no registration.

However, the trend is to erect

more barriers to voting.

"Since the 2010 election, new voting restrictions are slated to be in place in 22 states. Unless these restrictions are blocked - and there are court challenges to laws in six of those states - voters in nearly half the country could find it harder to cast a ballot in the 2014 midterm election than they did in 2010. The new laws range from photo ID requirements to early voting cutbacks to voter registration restrictions. Partisanship and race were key factors in this movement. Most restrictions passed through GOP-controlled legislatures and in states with increases in minority turnout," The Brennan Center for Justice at New York University reported.

Today's efforts to suppress the Black vote mirrors similar actions in the 1800s.

"Voter registration originated in the early 19th century as a method of disenfranchisement. Many states were concerned with the growing number of foreign-born transients

participating in local government, and so they developed a system of registration to ensure that these non-citizens could not vote. While this did disenfranchise transients and the foreign-born, many poor citizens were also not included on the voter rolls; they were often not home when the assessors came by, which was typically during the workday, so they were not included.

Many areas that were largely Democratic rebuffed the registration system, because most of the poor, immigrants, and other potentially disenfranchised groups tended to vote Democrat." Alexander Keyssar wrote in his book, *The Right to Vote: The Contested History of Democracy in the United States*.

He continued, "Near the beginning of the 20th century, other disenfranchisement issues arose, mostly concerning the ability of African-Americans to vote. Laws in the South were designed 'expressly' to administer in a discriminatory fashion,' where the validity of a vote due to small mismarks, an arbitrary assessment of a voter's 'understanding,' or other minutia would

be subject to the whim of an election official."

Our challenge today is to expand voter participation, not restrict it.

As the Center for Voting and Democracy noted, "The United States is one of only a few democracies in the world where the government does not take responsibility for registering voters. Instead, our government leaves the construction of voter rolls up to partisan and non-partisan voter registration organizations, political parties, election officials and active citizens."

It concluded, "Voter registration should be the mutual responsibility of citizens and their government. The government should not only facilitate registration; it should actively register adults who are eligible to vote as part of its responsibility to have accurate rolls. 100% voter registration should be the goal. Moreover, universal voter registration has the potential to bring together conservatives who are concerned about fraudulent voter registrations and liberals who are concerned about anemic political participation."

## COWBOYS WIN SIXTH STRAIGHT, MURRAY BREAKS 56-YEAR-OLD RECORD



AP - DeMarco Murray moved ahead of Jim Brown in the NFL record book. Tony Romo moved the Dallas Cowboys up and down the field for their sixth straight win.

Murray broke Brown's 56-year-old mark with his seventh straight 100-yard rushing game to start a season, Romo threw three touchdown passes and the Cowboys beat the New York Giants 31-21 Sunday.

Romo had a fourth scoring pass overturned on replay. Instead, Murray wound up with his seventh rushing touchdown of the season on a 1-yard plunge.

He finished with 128 yards on the ground to pass Brown, who hit the century mark in the first six games of the 1958 season for Cleveland.



The Cowboys (6-1) are off to their best start since winning six of their first seven on the way to a 13-3 finish in 2007, when they were the top seed in the NFC before losing to New York in their first playoff game.

Eli Manning had three touchdown passes for the Giants (3-4), who have lost road games to the NFC East's top two teams in consecutive weeks. New York now has two-game skids on either side of a three-game winning streak.

Dallas tight end Gavin Escobar had his first two-touchdown game, and Dez Bryant finished with a season-high 151 yards receiving. Romo was 17 of 23 for 279 yards with an interception.

Bryant had a touchdown taken away when he

stretched his left arm over the goal line as he was being tackled by Prince Amukamara. The call was overturned on review, and Murray scored on the next play for a 28-14 fourth-quarter lead.

Murray didn't return in the first half after falling down in the open field on his longest run before half-time, a 21-yard sprint around right end. He spent a few minutes with trainers on the sideline but didn't leave the field.

The fourth-year back from Oklahoma returned in the second half and broke Brown's record on a 1-yard plunge early in the fourth quarter after a 15-yard carry put him on the verge of setting the mark.




