## Twenty-Seven **Years Later: Suspect Arrested** in Murder of Tupac Shakur

Twenty-seven years after the death of one of the most noted rappers in history of the genre, a man has been arrested for the murder of rapper Tupac Shakur.

As the years have gone by some suspects have come into the news while others have passed away. On September 29, 2023, a man named Duane Keith Davis was arrested in Las Vegas and charged in connection with the murder of

Shakur.

The rapper and actor was killed on September 13, 1996 in Las Vegas, at the age of 25, after being shot four times. He died less than a week later at the University Medical Center of Southern Nevada. Since then, Shakur's death has lingered on as a mystery that has never been brought to a conclusion.

Democrat, Feinstein won recognition for her efforts to divides Republicans, a stance that occasionally drew criticism from progressive party members. She diverged from them on several significant issues, including her opposition to single-payer, government-run healthcare and her reservations about the ambitious Green New Deal. disproportionately impact women. EMILY's List was founded in 1985 by Ellen Malcolm and founding members Barbara Boxer, Ann Richards, Anne Wexler, and Donna Shalala. From 1985 through 2008, EMILY's List raised over \$240 million for political candidates.

The move by Newsom could assist him if he should run for higher office in 2024 or 2028. Newsom has been rumored to be on a short list of Democratic candidates who could run for President if for

some reason Biden or Harris are not options. But Newsom was recently asked about running for President and switched topics to the policies that he believed the party should be focused on.

Laphonza Butler will be yet another addition to the Congressional Black Caucus which is now on the brink of having 60 members for the first time in history. Though the current membership of the Congressional Black Caucus is 58, one more Black member is all but certain to enter Congress in Rhode Island after the resignation in May of

Congressman David Cicilline. Former Biden White House Office of Intergovernmental Affairs Deputy Director Gabe Amo won the Democratic nomination for Cicilline's The election is on November 7.

Butler will be the only Black woman in the Senate. Delaware Congresswoman Lisa Blunt Rochester is expected to win the Senate seat vacated by Senator Tom Carper. Carper announced he would not run for re-election in 2024 and Rochester announced shortly afterwards that she would run for Carper's seat.

"Throughout her career, Laphonza Butler has been a strong voice for working families, LGBTQ rights, and a champion for increasing women's representation in politics. I'm honored to welcome her to the United States Senate. Governor Newsom's swift action ensures that Californians maintain full representation in the Senate as we navigate a narrow Democratic majority. I look forward to working together to deliver for the people of California," wrote California U.S. Senator Alex Padilla in a statement.

downfall, as members of his party turned against him.

McCarthy's ouster marks the first successful vote to remove a speaker from the House Representatives. The last and only time Congress voted on such a measure was over a century ago, in 1910.

Before the vote, McCarthy,

who faced a protracted 15round battle in January to secure the speakership, made it clear that he would not seek assistance from Democrats. Such a move could have potentially saved his position. House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries (D-N.Y.) expressed the concerns of many in his caucus, citing significant trust issues with the Republican leadership,

including McCarthy.

"We dealt with a variety of different things, including coming into the session last month, and the first official act was to launch this illegitimate impeachment inquiry, presumably at the direction of the former twice-impeached insurrectionist-in-chief, Donald Trump," Jeffries said. "These are all the challenges that I think we confront."



### Paul's Earnest Prayer for THE BELIEVERS

**EPHESIANS 3:14-21** 



2:15), Paul urgently and sincerely prayed for these believers, desiring that they would be united experientially; moreover, that they would know experientially God's incomprehensible and surpassing love for This wonderful prayer for these believers may be outlined as follows: I. A Prayer of Great Concern for the Believers – Ephesians 3:14-19; II. A Doxology of Praise -Ephesians 3:20-21.

#### I. A Prayer of Great Concern for the **Believers – Ephesians** 3:14-19

In response to God's marvelous work of salvation for these believers,

Paul was moved to kneel before the Father in prayer (v. 14). Paul's position in kneeling in prayer is one of several postures for praying (standing, kneeling, lying prostrate) seen in the Scriptures. God the Father is the source of everything that believers have and enjoy in common with one another. From Him "the whole family in heaven and earth is named" (v. 15).

The "family" in this case refers to God's family – all those who have been redeemed and adopted as His sons and daughters through Christ. The who family derives its name or identity from Him. God is our Father. He is the first Father, the only One with "underived" fatherhood. In essence, every human family derives its name, that is, exists as a family with a father, because of Him. Paul directed his prayer to the right source – God the

Paul continued to pray in verses 16-17 that the Father would strengthen the believers "with might by His Spirit in the inner man." This strengthening is pictured as a gift from the Father, coming from the "riches of His glory." The verb for "strengthened" speaks of the fortitude or courage needed to resist evil or temptation (v. 16). The strengthening that Paul is referring to comes through the dynamic power of the Holy Spirit, who indwells within "the inner man" (v. 16) that is, within our innermost being.

Our Christian life ought to be one of continual inner renewal. The purpose of being strengthened within is that "Christ may dwell in our hearts by faith." Christ

desires to "be at home in" or deeply rooted in our lives (v. 17). Christ will be the dominating factor in our lives as we trust Him and as we are "rooted and grounded in love" (v. 17). In essence, as believers, we are to allow Christ to become the dominating factor in our attitudes and conduct.

In verse 18, Paul prayed, moreover, that the believers would be given the ability or inward power "to comprehend" or grasp "what is the breadth and length, depth and height of the love of Christ." These four measurements illustrate the immensity or vastness of the love that we are privileged and exhorted to seek to comprehend. As we seek to comprehend Christ's love for us, let us try to briefly measure: Christ's love is "wide

enough to reach the whole world and beyond; His love is long enough to stretch from eternity to eternity; His love is high enough to raise both Gentiles and Jews to heavenly places in Christ; and His love is deep enough to rescue people from sin's

degradation. In verse 19, Paul stated that Christ's love "passeth knowledge", meaning that it cannot be completely known; however, we can know it intimately. The purpose for knowing the love of Christ is so that we "might be filled with all the fulness of God" (v. 19). The fulness of the Godhead is only in Christ, and through Him is a believer made complete (Col. 2:9-10). Brothers and sisters, the more we are filled with God's moral excellence, the more we will experientially love one another! II. A Doxology of Praise - Ephesians 3:20-21

Paul closed this prayer with a grand doxology. He praised God who is able to do far more than one could ask or imagine, according to the standard of His power that is at work within us (v. 20). No human or angel would ever fathom that Jews and Gentiles could function together in one body. By God's power of love. Paul was confident that Jewish and Gentile believers can function and love one another. Paul therefore ascribed to God glory, which is to be manifested in the church, where the miracle of love will occur, and in Christ Jesus, who made the union of

# Rangers beat Rays 7-1 for Wild Card Series sweep behind Garcia and Carter home runs

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP) — Adolis García and Evan Carter homered to back Nathan Eovaldi, and the Texas Rangers beat the punchless Tampa Bay Rays 7-1 Wednesday to finish a two-game AL Wild Card Series sweep.

20-year-old rookie who became the secondyoungest postseason player in franchise history, homered off 16-game winner Zach Eflin, who

was unable to save Tampa Bay's season.

Texas advanced to a Division Series at AL East champion Baltimore starting Saturday. The Rays' scoreless streak reached 33 innings, one shy of the postseason record held by the 1966-74 Los Angeles Garcia and Carter, a Dodgers, before Curtis Mead's RBI single in the seventh.

> Texas won a postseason series for the first time since 2011, when the Rangers reached

World Series before losing to St. Louis.

Tampa Bay followed a stellar start with a fizzling finish. The Rays opened 13-0 to match the 1982 Atlanta Braves and 1987 Brewers. Milwaukee trailing only the 20-0 start by the 1884 St. Louis Maroons of the Union Association. The Rays led the AL West from opening day and then were overtaken by the Orioles in mid-July.

After gaining the AL's

second wild card, Tampa Eflin. Josh Jung had a Bay lost its seventh straight postseason game. In getting swept in consecutive Wild Card Series, the Rays scored two runs over four games while hitting .161.

Eovaldi, beating the Rays for the third time this year, season, allowed six hits while striking out eight and walking none over 6 2/3 innings.

Garcia's leadoff homer began a four-run fourth inning against loser Zach

RBI triple and Carter hit a two-run homer to right for the Rangers, 7-0 in postseason games Tropicana Field.

Carter hit .306 with five homers and 12 RBIs over 23 games after making his major league debut on Sept. 8. He reached base in his first six postseason at-bats, doubling twice and drawing three walks.

The Rays finally got an out from the No. 9 hole

when Colin Poche fanned Carter in the sixth inning. Marcus Semien Corey Seager followed at with run-scoring doubles.

> Attendance for Game 2 was 20,198, another below-sellout crowd at Tropicana Field but up slightly from Tuesday's 19,704. That was the lowest figure for a major league postseason game since the 1919 World Series, other than 2020 games played during the coronavirus pandemic.

Davis is a member of the California-based gang known as The South Side Compton Crips and was a childhood friend N.W.A. member Eazy-E. During the early '90s, Davis built a friendly relationship with Sean "Diddy" Combs. Rumors that someone would be charged in Shakur's death have swirled for years with no arrests made.

Tupac's life was short but marked by artistic achievement in music and acting. His family moved to Baltimore and he attended the Baltimore School for the Arts, where he studied acting, poetry, jazz, and ballet. In the late 1980s, Tupac moved to California, where he joined the hip-hop group Digital Underground as a backup dancer and rapper. He gained recognition for his skills and charisma on stage.

In addition to his storied music career, Shakur pursued acting and appeared in films such as "Juice" (1992), "Poetic Justice" (1993), "Above the Rim" (1994), and "Gridlock'd" (1997). He received praise for his acting talent.

Tupac Shakur was born in East Harlem to Afeni Shakur, a former Black Panther, and Billy Garland. He was given the name Lesane Parish Crooks at birth but later changed it to Tupac Amaru Shakur after he was inspired by the 18th-century Peruvian revolutionary Túpac Amaru II.

This is a cautionary tale.

Most folks know how Adolph Hitler's career as an autocratic dictator ended, but many do not know how it began. It is important to know about the rise of Hitler and the Nazi Party because those who ignore history are doomed to repeat it.

So, how did this evil little man with little formal education and no military experience beyond being a corporal in Germany's army in World War I become powerful enough to drive the entire world into chaos, war and disaster?

After Germany's defeat in World War I, one of the conditions of its surrender to the Allies under the Treaty of Versailles was a set of very heavy financial

obligations to pay for the destruction it had caused during the war. These obligations were disastrous to Germany's economy and jobs were hard to find. Hitler, uneducated, unskilled and having no other prospects, remained in the German army.

The army made Hitler an intelligence agent and, in 1919, assigned him to spy on the German Workers' Party (DAP). The DAP was an extremely nationalistic, anti-Semitic and anti-Marxist organization. But instead of working to dismantle the DAP, Hitler became a believer while still drawing his army pay for the spying he was supposed to be doing. As a DAP member, he sought to appeal to the German working class to create a "people's community," where German identity took precedence over class, religion or other characteristics.

By October 1919, Hitler gave his first speech for the DAP and quickly became the party's most popular speaker. He ceased being a spy for the German army in 1920 and, using his charisma and the politics of grievance, became the party's chief of propaganda. One of his main targets was the Treaty of Versailles, which placed a heavy financial burden on Germans. His new goal was to bring ultranationalism to the German public. In February 1920, the German Workers' Party was renamed the National Socialist German Workers' Party (NSDAP). We all know the NSDAP as the Nazi Party.

By July 1921, Hitler was the leader of the Nazi Party. In November 1923, Hitler and his Nazi followers attempted a failed takeover of the government in Bavaria, a state in southern Germany. This coup attempt, known as the "Beer Hall Putsch," involved the Nazis storming Bavarian government building, leaving 16 party members and four police officers dead. Hitler was arrested and tried for high treason, and in April 1924, he was sentenced to five years in prison.

In December 1924, over the objections of his prosecutors, Hitler was released from prison. He immediately began to rebuild the Nazi Party. He met with the prime minister of Bavaria in January 1925 and promised to respect the state's author-

ity. He claimed he would seek political power only through the democratic process. This meeting led to the lifting of the ban on the Nazi Party that had been in place since the Beer Hall Putsch. But one month after the meeting, Hitler was barred from public speaking by the Bavarian authorities after making an inflammatory speech.

Undeterred by the ban, Hitler continued organizing and enlarging the Nazi Party. And when the stock market in the United States crashed in October 1929, the impact in Germany was catastrophic. Millions became unemployed and banks began to collapse. Doubling down on their platform of grievances, Hitler and the Nazi Party took advantage of the crisis to gain greater support. They promised to lift the burdens of the Treaty of Versailles, strengthen the economy and provide jobs. By 1930, the Nazi Party

had become the secondlargest political party in Germany. It became the largest in 1932. Hitler became chancellor of Germany in 1933 and

### Code at the State Fair: Sanitarians perform pre-inspections of food vendors



Being thorough is a very important part of Eduardo Carrizales' job.

"I want to check everything," said Carrizales, Senior Sanitarian, City of Dallas Code Compliance.

Throughout the year Carrizales and others in Code have caseloads full of food establishments, but this month the State Fair takes precedence.

"The work that we do performing regular inspections at restaurants does prepare you to do inspections here at the Fair," said Carrizales.

Today, as the setup for the festivities continues, Carrizales is working with his list of vendors for pre-inspections.

"Our form has a long checklist of making sure we check everything, the structure, making sure they have hot water, cold water, making sure they have their food thermometer," Carrizales.

Last year, Code performed over 900 food inspections at the State Fair. In his sixth year with the city, Carrizales knows who is most vulnerable and why preinspections are just as important.

"My biggest concern is kids and the elderly. They're the population that would be most greatly affected if they were to get sick," said Carrizales.

His efforts give a glimpse into the method of meticulousness sanitarians in Code need.

"I don't want to be in the news and the fair to be featured that there was a food-borne illness and there were so many people who got sick. I want to prevent something like that," said Carrizales.

For the millions of people coming to the fair this year who want to try different foods, Carrizales leaves you with a little advice.

"Come to the fair. There's an inspector here every day, just have fun," said Carrizales.

room for all of us. Arnold, back from his army service and married to Fronette, moved into a house at the rear of the property. Azella and Ozella, a year ahead of me in school, could walk from our house to nearby E. O. Smith Junior High School. I had to transfer to a new school, which, for the first time in my life, I would attend without my sisters. Though I was fearful of this change, in the end I found it easy to adjust to the Quitman Avenue Elementary School and, a year later, I started junior high at E. O. Smith.

E. O. Smith Junior High School was a large stucco building on Lyons Avenue that came to have iconic status in the Fifth Ward. It had been the site of Phillis Wheatley High School until the student population outgrew its capacity and the high school was moved to a

Street. In the tradition of other Fifth Ward schools, the teachers of E. O. Smith shaped generations of achievers in the Black community. Segregation drove Black teachers to Black schools, affording students the best minds that the Black community produced during the pre-civil-rights era. Exceptional teachers at E. O. Smith made learning challenging and enjoyable for me, and one of them, Mrs. Modria Caraway, my social studies teacher, had a significant influence on my direction in life.

Mrs. Caraway was very dark, with a broad forehead that was even more exposed because of her thin hair. Her skin was beautiful, and she was scrupulous about makeup that enhanced her looks. One couldn't say that she was a beauty by any means, but her dress, makeup, and hair made us aware that she was a person who

was attentive to every aspect of her appearance. She had a droll and entertaining wit that often prompted her to make shocking comments to her classes. There was little temporizing in her approach; her tongue was sharp and her criticism quick and unmoderated. She spoke to us about sex, about associating with the wrong types of friends, and about the importance of making something of our lives. Insisting that our success would rest on whether we understood the lessons of history, she forced us to memorize important dates and events. She would regularly remind us, "You cheerin had better listen to me and do your work, or you're going to be just as ignorant as those niggas you see standing around on Lyons Avenue." We would laugh delightedly at her outrageous, though racist, comments.

chancellor and president in 1934. And as is often said, "The rest is history."

This is a cautionary tale because what happened in Germany during the first half of the 20th century could happen anywhere in the world, given the right ingredients.

Ultranationalism in the form of identity politics that promotes notions of supremacy and a baseless sense of entitlement are essential to the recipe for the type of authoritarian leadership that Germany on its selfdestructive path. Grievance politics and a tendency to blame the most vulnerable among us are also key ingredients. This devil's brew is toxic to any democracy and there are those who today are concocting a poisonous serving of hate,

discord and chaos to illegit-

imately gain the power to

create a world to their advantage and their advantage alone.

We need not be so polite

as to shy away from calling out a liar for being a liar. We should never be so timid as to hold back from calling a would-be autocrat a would-be autocrat. A twice impeached, four times criminally indicted, adjudged sexual abuser stands at the threshold of once again gaining the Republican Party nomination to carry their banner to the highest office in this land, and we must not be so "mannerly" as to not call him out for what he is. Germany chose a leader in the first half of the 20th century that brought their country to ruin. It is not impossible that America can do the same.

Donald Trump has shown the world what he is capable of. His MAGA followers have shown us the depths of their depravity.

America is in a very dangerous place at this moment. It serves no purpose and makes no sense to be civil with the uncivil or to be courteous with the discourteous. One does not accept a dinner invitation from cannibals. You will either be forced to eat your neighbor or be served up yourself.

I do believe Donald Trump will be sent to prison. If he is not, then this country is in worse shape than I imagined. But setting aside the absolute worst, the most important question before American people is, once he is sent to prison, what happens after that?
