

(AP) - President Barack Obama, Thursday night, September 6, 2012 declared in his Democratic National Convention speech, "Our problems can be solved, our challenges can be met."

His speech was the final act of his national convention, and the opening salvo of a two-month drive toward Election Day in his race against Republican rival Mitt Romney.

The convention's final night also included a nomination acceptance speech from Vice President Joe Biden, whose appeal to blue collar voters rivals or even exceeds Obama's own.

The president was introduced by first lady Michelle Obama, who also spoke on the convention's opening night as the Democrats sought to capitalize on her popularity.

Delegates who packed into their convention hall were serenaded by singer James Taylor and rocked by R&B blues artist Mary J. Blige as they awaited Obama's speech. Other speakers at the Democratic National Convention included: Former U.S. President, Bill Clinton; San Antonio Mayor, Julian Castro, and many more.



Dr. Ben Foster is a native of Morrilton, Arkansas. He has been actively involved in the ministry for forty-six years. He is constantly in demand for gospel meetings, teacher training workshops, leadership workshops, conflict resolution issues, and for speaking in the interest of Christian education. He has spoken at local, state and national lectureships.

Facts:

On Monday evening, September 10, 2012, hundreds gathered at Horn High School in Mesquite for a candlelight vigil in memory of former student, and friend Shania Gray.

Police have arrested the man who admitted to killing the 16 year-old found slain last Thursday.





Many bible students advance that this psalm can be classified as a Royal psalm. As King David prepared for war, the assembled worshippers, congregants, prayed antiphonally that God would answer the petition of the King and grant him victory and protection - "The LORD hear thee in the day of trouble; the name of the God of Jacob defend thee;" (v. 1). In the assembled worshippers' request, help was needed, for verse 2 says - "Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Zion."

The sanctuary is the tabernacle, the dwelling

"A Prayer of Victory for the King" Psalm 20:1-9


place of God; Zion refers to Jerusalem, the city of God. As believers, we should remember that it is always wise to call on the Lord at all times, especially when we are in a crisis situation. These congregants were engaged in prayer for the King; moreover, the King needed prayer because he was about to engage in war. According to Ephesians chapter 6, prayer is very essential for believers as we engage in spiritual warfare against the stratagems of Satan. As we engage in battle, we need to be equipped with the proper armament and we need to be fortified with prayer. These congregants even prayed that the King's offerings would be acceptable to God and the King's plans might

be accomplished (v. 4). Praying in such a unified manner, the congregants expressed their confidence that God was going to answer the Kings' prayers. Observe their triumphant prayer of victory expressed in verse 5, that reads - "we will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the Lord fulfill all thy petitions." This great triumphant prayer of victory by these congregants reminds me of another congregation that sung triumphantly after being emancipated from Egyptian bondage in Exodus 15:1-21. Because the Lord had saved Israel at the Red Sea, the Israelites' sung triumphantly of the Lord's deliverance.

After Jonah was delivered from the great fish, Jonah testified that "Salvation is of the Lord" (Jonah 2:9).

Moreover, the King expressed supreme confidence that God would deliver him, for verse 6 reads - "Now know I that the Lord saith his anointed: He will hear him from His holy heaven with the saving strength of His right hand." In verses 7-8, David the King is assured of victory because He places his trust in the Lord, and not in military resources. This psalm ends with the congregants petitioning the Lord to manifest the assurance of the King's victory in battle.

PROP- What causes fights and quarrels?

- 1- Wrong desires
- 2- Wrong directions
- 3- Wrong motives

I. WRONG DESIRES

What causes fights and quarrels among you? Don't they come from your desires that battle within you? To desire something is to crave something or want something. And sometimes our cravings are evil.

II. WRONG DIRECTIONS

You want something but don't get it. You kill and covet, but you cannot have what you want. You quarrel and fight. You do not have, because you do not ask God.

We sometimes go to

the wrong source for what we need in life. Instead of asking God, we go elsewhere. We have the wrong directions. Or we are going in the wrong direction.

III. WRONG MOTIVES

When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures.

For example:

Some go to church just for a walk,
Some go to church to laugh and talk,
Some go there the time to spend,
Some go there to meet a friend.
Some go there for speculation-
Some go there for

observation,
Some go there to doze and nod,
Some, how few, to worship God.

Why do you go to church? **WHAT'S YOUR MOTIVE?** Do you go for the right reason or the wrong reason.

In conclusion, what causes fights and quarrels? We may not always know what causes fights and quarrels, but we should know how to stop them! And there is really only one way to stop all fighting and quarrels and that is to seek the Lord. To do His will. To yield in obedience to His Word. When we strive to do His will He will empower us to be overcomers!

Redskins' Robert Griffin III is 1st Rookie QB to Win Player of Week Award after Debut Game



(AP) - Robert Griffin III is the first rookie quarterback to win an offensive player of the week award after his debut game.

The NFL announced Wednesday that Griffin is the NFC offensive player of the week for his performance in the Washington Redskins'

40-32 win over the New Orleans Saints.

The No. 2 overall draft pick completed 19 of 26 passes for 320 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions in Sunday's victory — making him

the first player in league history to amass 300-plus yards passing,

two or more passing touchdowns and no interceptions in an NFL debut.

Griffin is also the first rookie quarterback to throw for at least 300 yards and win a season opener.

The league started giving the player of the week awards in 1984.

Former Dallas Cowboy Roy Williams Retires

(AP) - Four years after the fact, the centerpiece in what many believe to be the worst trade in Dallas Cowboys history is walking away from the game.

Roy Williams, who spent time with Detroit and Dallas before playing out 2011 with the Chicago Bears, said on Facebook on Saturday morning that he would

retire rather than continue trying to get on with a fourth NFL team.

In his statement, he admitted that not all of his career had gone the way he'd have imagined--particularly after being traded to Dallas midway through the 2008 season.

After sending a first, third and fifth round pick to Detroit for the

Texas alum's services, the Cowboys watched Williams struggle through two and a half seasons, grabbing a total of 94 catches and 13 touchdowns. He was cut following the 2010 season as the Cowboys attempted to dump salary before 2011.

All things considered though, Williams walks away with his head held high.

"I accomplished what I wanted except for a Super Bowl," Williams said, per the Fort Worth Star-Telegram. "I got traded to America's team. That dream came true. It was up and down. The last two teams I played for were the most traditional teams in the NFL."

A police arrest warrant says he tried to find out what she would say on the stand by posing as a teenage boy on Facebook. He picked her up from high school (Hebron HS in Carrollton, Texas; where she recently transferred to) last week, drove her to the nearby Trinity River in Irving, and shot her. Davis faces a capital murder charge.
